

I. Business Meeting Call To Order

Chairman Bashaw called the business meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

II. Consent Agenda

ACTION: Sandra Buck-Camp moved to approve the consent agenda. Matthew Pearson seconded; motion passed unanimously.

III. General Business

A. New Business

1. 2016/17 Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan

Ms. Lynn Godfrey, North Central Florida Regional Planning Council Senior Planner, stated that Chapter 427, Florida Statutes requires Suwannee Valley Transit Authority to prepare a Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan in cooperation with the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council for the local Coordinating Board's approval. She said the Service Plan must be submitted to the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged annually.

The Board reviewed the 2016/17 Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan.

Mr. John Irvine, Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged Project Manager, suggested clarifying the Transportation Disadvantaged Program eligibility criteria by adding the following language on page 44 of the Plan:

"The following criteria will be used to determine Transportation Disadvantaged Program eligibility:

- Unable to obtain transportation: Individual does not have an operational vehicle in the household; or the ability to operate a vehicle; or the ability to obtain transportation from other sources <u>due to physical or mental</u> <u>disability</u>, income status, or age.
- Unable to transport themselves: Individual is not sponsored by any agency or organization for their transportation needs or have the ability to operate a vehicle <u>due to physical or mental disability</u>, income status, or age."

ACTION: Ralph Kitchens moved to add the eligibility criteria language suggested by Mr. Irvine. Sandra Buck Camp seconded;

The Board discussed the motion on the floor.

motion failed.

ACTION: Matthew Pearson moved to approve the Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan. Audre' Washington seconded; motion passed unanimously.

2. Fiscal Year 2016/17 Transportation Disadvantaged Program Rate Calculation Model and Service Rates

Mr. Larry Sessions, Suwannee Valley Transit Authority Administrator, discussed Suwannee Valley Transit Authority's proposed rates for Fiscal Year 2016/17. He said the proposed rates are less than the current rates.

The Board reviewed the rate calculation model and proposed rates.

ACTION: Sandra Buck-Camp moved to approve Suwannee Valley Transit Authority's Fiscal Year 2016/17 Rate Calculation Model and service rates. Daniel Taylor seconded; motion passed unanimously.

3. Memorandum of Agreement

Ms. Godfrey stated that the Memorandum of Agreement is a binding contract between the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged and Suwannee Valley Transit Authority. She said the Memorandum of Agreement recognizes Suwannee Valley Transit Authority the Community Transportation Coordinator for Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Counties. She stated that the Memorandum of Agreement is effective July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2021.

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Ms. Godfrey said the Board is required to approve the Memorandum of Agreement.

ACTION: Ralph Kitchens moved to approve the Memorandum of Agreement. Sandra Buck-Camp seconded; motion passed unanimously.

4. 2016 Florida Legislative Session

Ms. Godfrey stated that the Florida Legislature authorized an increase in Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Funds in Fiscal Year 2016-17. She said the additional funds will be used to provide additional transportation services in rural and for competitive grants.

B. Other Business

1. Board Members

Sandra Buck-Camp stated that a fixed route bus system is needed in Lake City,

Jeannie Carr asked who would be responsible for starting the planning process for a fixed route bus system.

Chair Bashaw stated that Suwannee Valley Transit Authority would need to work with the Florida Department of Transportation, Lake City and Columbia County to plan and develop a fixed route bus system.

Larry Sessions discussed some of the difficulties involved in establishing a fixed route bus system.

Sandra Collins stated that she appreciates the work Suwannee Valley Transit Authority and the Board are doing.

Audre' Washington asked if Suwannee Valley Transit Authority could assist with providing transportation to disadvantaged children this Summer.

Bo Beauchemin discussed his knowledge of developing and starting a fixed route bus system. He said a study would be needed and a possible funding source is the local gas tax.

Daniel Taylor discussed safety concerns with buses stopping in vehicle lanes.

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LJ Two Spirits Johnson suggested all Suwannee Valley Transit Authority employees have a background screening conducted on them. He also suggested a code of conduct for Suwannee Valley Transit Authority employees.

Sandra Buck-Camp questioned why the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council receives the same amount of planning funds to staff one Board as when they staffed three Boards.

2. Citizens

Ms. Barbara Lemley suggested Suwannee Valley Transit Authority provide ondemand service.

3. Staff

There were no comments.

Chair Bashaw announced the next meeting will be held August 10, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. in Live Oak, Florida.

Chairman Bashaw called the public hearing to order at 10:00 a.m.

A. Invocation

Chair Bashaw gave the invocation.

B. Pledge of Allegiance

Chair Bashaw led the Board in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

C. Introductions

Chair Bashaw asked new Board members and visitors to introduce themselves.

D. Receive Public Testimony

Chair Bashaw asked if anyone wanted to provide input to the Board regarding unmet transportation needs or any other areas that relate to the local transportation services provided under Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged Program for Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Counties.

Ms. Barbara Lemley questioned the legality of the public hearing legal notice. She also suggested that Suwannee Valley Transit Authority provide on demand service with small vehicles rather than operating the large buses that she sees only transporting a few passengers.

Mr. LJ Two Spirits Johnson stated that all Suwannee Valley Transit Authority job applicants should be required to have a background screening conducted before they are hired.

Mr. Stew Lilker questioned the legality of the legal notice used to advertise the public hearing. He submitted his concerns in writing to staff for the record.

Mr. Ralph Kitchens said the general public needs access to public transportation services as well as the transportation disadvantaged population. He said he would like Lake City to establish a mass transit system.

Mr. Larry Sessions, Suwannee Valley Transit Authority Administrator, discussed the difficulties with establishing a fixed route transit system in Lake City. He said Suwannee Valley Transit Authority has attempted to establish routes in the past which were unsuccessful. He said he believes Suwannee Valley Transit Authority is doing a good job providing public transportation services with the resources they have.

Mr. Richard Bryant stated that Suwannee Valley Transit Authority is doing a good job transporting people. He said he uses their services and the buses are oftentimes full.

Chair Bashaw closed the public hearing at 10:20 a.m.

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Chapter I: Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board Bylaws

A. Preamble

The following sets forth the bylaws which shall serve to guide the proper functioning of the Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board. The intent is to provide procedures and policies for fulfilling the requirements of Chapter 427, Florida Statutes, Rule 41-2, Florida Administrative Code, and subsequent laws setting forth requirements for the coordination of transportation services to the transportation disadvantaged.

B. Agency Description

The Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board is a public body appointed by the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council serving as the Designated Official Planning Agency as authorized by Section 427.015, Florida Statutes.

C. Definitions

Transportation disadvantaged means those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation and are, therefore, dependent upon others to obtain access to health care, employment, education, shopping, social activities, or other life-sustaining activities, or children who are handicapped or high-risk or at-risk as defined in Section 411.202, Florida Statutes.

Agency means an official, officer, commission, authority, council, committee, department, division, bureau, board, section, or any other unit or entity of the state or of a city, town, municipality, county, or other local governing body or a private nonprofit transportation service-providing agency.

Community Transportation Coordinator means a transportation entity recommended by a metropolitan planning organization, or by the appropriate designated official planning agency as provided for in Section 427.011, Florida Statutes in an area outside the purview of a metropolitan planning organization, to ensure that coordinated transportation services are provided to the transportation disadvantaged population in a designated service area.

Coordinating Board means an advisory entity in each designated service area composed of representatives appointed by the metropolitan planning organization or designated official planning agency, to provide assistance to the community transportation coordinator relative to the coordination of transportation services.

Coordination means the arrangement for the provision of transportation services to the transportation disadvantaged in a manner that is cost-effective, efficient and reduces fragmentation and duplication of services.

Designated Official Planning Agency means the official body or agency designated by the Commission to fulfill the functions of transportation disadvantaged planning in areas not covered by a Metropolitan Planning Organization. The Metropolitan Planning Organization shall serve as the designated official planning agency in areas covered by such organizations.

Designated Service Area means a geographical area recommended by a designated official planning agency, subject to approval by the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged, which defines the community where coordinated transportation services will be provided to the transportation disadvantaged.

Florida Coordinated Transportation System means a transportation system responsible for coordination and service provisions for the transportation disadvantaged as outlined in Chapter 427, Florida Statutes.

Memorandum of Agreement is the state contract for transportation disadvantaged services purchased with federal, state or local government transportation disadvantaged funds. This agreement is between the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged and the Community Transportation Coordinator and recognizes the Community Transportation Coordinator as being responsible for the arrangement of the provision of transportation disadvantaged services for a designated service area.

Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan means an annually updated plan jointly developed by the Designated Official Planning Agency and the Community Transportation Coordinator which contains a development plan, service plan and quality assurance components. The plan shall be approved and used by the local Coordinating Board to evaluate the Community Transportation Coordinator.

D. Name and Purpose

- (1) The name of the Coordinating Board shall be the Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board, hereinafter referred to as the Board.
- (2) The purpose of the Board is to identify local service needs and provide information, advice and direction to the Community Transportation Coordinator on the provision of services to the transportation disadvantaged within the designated service area. In general, the Board is considered an advisory body (Section 427.0157, Florida Statutes).

E. Membership

- (1) Voting Members. In accordance with Section 427.0157, Florida Statutes, all voting members of the Board shall be appointed by the Designated Official Planning Agency. The Designated Official Planning Agency for Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee is the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council.
 - (a) An elected official from each county of the multi-county service area shall be appointed to the Board.
 - (b) A local representative of the Florida Department of Transportation;
 - (c) A local representative of the Florida Department of Children and Family Services;

- (d) A local representative of the Public Education Community which could include, but not be limited to, a representative of the District School Board, School Board Transportation Office or Headstart Program in areas where the School District is responsible;
- (e) In areas where they exist, a local representative of the Florida Division of Vocational Rehabilitation or the Division of Blind Services, representing the Department of Education;
- (f) A person recommended by the local Veterans Service Office representing the veterans of the service area;
- (g) A person who is recognized by the Florida Association for Community Action (President), representing the economically disadvantaged in the service area;
- (h) A person over age sixty (60) representing the elderly in the service area;
- (i) A person with a disability representing the disabled in the service area;
- Two citizen advocate representatives in the service area; one who must be a person who uses the transportation service(s) of the system as their primary means of transportation;
- (k) A local representative for children at risk;
- (I) In areas where they exist, the Chairperson or designee of the local Mass Transit or Public Transit System's Board, except in cases where they are also the Community Transportation Coordinator;
- (m) A local representative of the Florida Department of Elder Affairs;
- (n) An experienced representative of the local private for profit transportation industry. In areas where such representative is not available, a local private non profit representative shall be appointed, except where said representative is also the Community Transportation Coordinator;
- (o) A local representative of the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration;
- (p) A representative of the Regional Workforce Development Board established in Chapter 445, Florida Statutes; and
- (q) A representative of the local medical community, which may include, but not be limited to, kidney dialysis centers, long term care facilities, assisted living facilities, hospitals, local health department or other home and community based services, etc.
- (r) No employee of a Community Transportation Coordinator shall serve as a voting member of the Coordinating Board in an area where the Community Transportation Coordinator serves. However, an elected official serving as a member of the Community Transportation Coordinator's Board of Directors, or other governmental employees that are not employed for the purpose of making provisions for transportation and are not directly supervised by the Community Transportation Coordinator, shall not be precluded from serving as voting members of the Coordinating Board. It is the intent of the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged for the membership of the Board to represent to the maximum extent possible a cross section of their local community.

- (2) Alternate Members. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council may appoint one alternate member to represent appointed voting members in their absence. Alternate members may vote only in the absence of the voting member on a one-vote-per-member basis. Alternate members must be a representative of the same interest as the primary member.
- (3) Terms of Appointment. Except for the Chair, non-agency members of the Board shall be appointed for three-year staggered terms with initial membership being appointed equally for one, two and three years. The Chair shall serve until elected term of office has expired or otherwise replaced by the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council. There are no limits to the number of terms served by any member of the Board.
- (4) Termination of Membership. Any member of the Board may resign at any time. Each member of the Board is expected to demonstrate his/her interest in the Board's activities through attendance of the scheduled meetings, except for reasons of an unavoidable nature. In each instance of an unavoidable absence, the absent member should ensure that his/her alternate will attend.

F. Officers

Officers shall be the Chair, Vice-Chair and Grievance Committee Chair.

(a) The Chair shall be one of the local elected officials from Columbia, Hamilton or Suwannee Counties. The Chair shall preside at all meetings.

(b) The Vice-Chair shall be one of the local elected officials from Columbia, Hamilton or Suwannee Counties. In the event of the Chair's absence, the Vice-Chair shall assume the duties of the Chair.

(c) Grievance Committee Chair. The Grievance Committee Chair shall be one of the local elected officials from Columbia, Hamilton or Suwannee Counties who is not serving as Chair or Vice-Chair of the Board. In the event the local elected official not serving as Chair or Vice-Chair of the Board does not wish to serve as Chair of the Grievance Committee, the Vice-Chair shall serve as Chair of the Grievance Committee.

(2) Officers shall be appointed as follows:

Chair. On or before the third Wednesday of May each year, the Board shall recommend a Chair to the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council shall appoint the Chair for a one-year term beginning July 1 and ending June 30. The Chair shall serve until their elected term of office has expired or otherwise replaced by the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council. The appointed Chair shall not be eligible to serve a one year successive term of appointment.

Vice-Chair. On or before the third Wednesday of May each year, the Vice-Chair shall be elected by a majority vote of a quorum of the members of the Board present. The Vice-Chair shall serve a one-year term beginning July 1 and ending June 30. The Vice-Chair shall not be eligible to serve a one-year successive term of appointment.

Bylaws

- (1) Chair. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council shall appoint the Chair for a one year term. The Chair shall be a local elected official appointed from one of the counties in the designated service area. The Board shall hold an organizational meeting each year for the purpose of recommending a Chair to the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council. The Chair shall serve until their elected term of office has expired or otherwise replaced by the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council. The appointed Chair shall not be eligible to serve a one year successive term of appointment. The Chair shall preside at all meetings.
- (2) Vice Chair. The Vice Chair shall be one of the local elected officials from Columbia, Hamilton or Suwannee Counties. The Vice Chair shall be elected by a majority vote of a quorum of the members of the Board present each year. The Vice Chair shall serve a term of one year starting with the next meeting. In the event of the Chair's absence, the Vice Chair shall assume the duties of the Chairperson and conduct the meeting. The Vice Chair shall not be eligible to serve a one year successive term.
- (3) Grievance Committee Chair. The Grievance Committee Chair shall be one of the local elected officials from Columbia, Hamilton or Suwannee Counties who is not serving as Chair or Vice Chair of the Board. In the event the local elected official not serving as Chair or Vice Chair of the Board does not wish to serve as Chair of the Grievance Committee, the Vice Chair shall serve as Chair of the Grievance Committee.

G. Meetings

- (1) Business Meetings. The Board shall meet at least quarterly. The Board may meet as often as necessary to fulfill its responsibilities as set forth in Section 427.0157, Florida Statutes. Business meetings of the Board may be called, rescheduled, postponed or cancelled for any appropriate purpose by the Chair. All meetings will function under the "Government in the Sunshine Law." All meetings will provide opportunity for public comments on the agenda. The Board shall conduct business using parliamentary procedures according to Roberts Rules of Order. Audio recordings shall be made of all Board meetings.
- (2) Emergency Meetings. The Board may hold emergency meetings in order to transact business necessary to ensure the continuation of services to the transportation disadvantaged population. Emergency meetings may be called by the Chair or by writing by 1/3 of the Board's voting membership. North Central Florida Regional Planning Council staff shall give the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged, Board members and all interested parties one week notice, if possible, of the date, time, location and proposed agenda for the emergency meeting. Meeting materials shall be provided as early as possible. Emergency meetings shall be advertised at a minimum, in the largest general circulation newspaper in the designated service area as soon as possible prior to the meeting.
- (3) Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board may be called for any appropriate purpose by the Chair or by written request of at least seven (7) voting members of the Board. <u>Special</u> <u>meetings of the Board may be rescheduled, postponed or cancelled for any appropriate purpose</u> <u>by the Chair.</u>

- (4) Public Workshop. The Board shall hold a public workshop annually for the purpose of receiving input regarding unmet transportation needs or any other areas that relate to the local transportation services provided under Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged Program in Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Counties. The public workshop may be called, rescheduled, postponed or cancelled for any appropriate purpose by the Chair.
- (4<u>5</u>) Notice of Regular and Special Meetings. All meetings, public hearings, committee meetings, etc. shall be advertised, at a minimum, in the largest general circulation newspaper in the designated service area prior to the meeting. Meeting notices shall include the date, time and location, general nature/subject of the meeting a contact person and phone number to call for additional information and to request accessible meeting material formats.

The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council shall provide the agenda and meeting package to the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged, Board members and all other interested parties prior to the meeting. The agenda shall include a public participation opportunity.

- (56) Quorum. At all meetings of the Board, the presence in person of a majority of the voting members shall be necessary and sufficient to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. In the absence of a quorum, those present may, without notice other than by announcement at the meeting, recess the meeting from time to time, until a quorum shall be present. At any such recessed meeting, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called. In the absence of a quorum, the members present may also elect to either:
 - a) Cancel and reschedule the meeting; or
 - b) Continue to meet and discuss agenda items for informational purposes only. Agenda items that require formal action shall be presented at a future meeting where a quorum is present.

Board members can participate (and vote) in meetings via conference call, however, a physical quorum must be present to vote on agenda items that require formal action.

- (6<u>7</u>) Voting. At all meetings of the Board at which a quorum is present, all matters, except as otherwise expressly required by law or these Bylaws, shall be decided by the vote of a majority of the members of the Board present. As required by Section 286.012, Florida Statutes, all Board members, including the Chair of the Board, must vote on all official actions taken by the Board except when there appears to be a possible conflict of interest with a member or members of the Board.
- (78) Conflict of Interest. In accordance with Chapter 112 (Part III), Florida Statutes, "No county, municipal, or other public office shall vote in an official capacity upon any measure which would inure to his or her special private gain or loss, or which the officer know would inure to the special private gain or loss of a principal by whom he or she is retained, of the parent organization or subsidiary of a corporate principal which he or she is retained, of a relative or of a business associate. The officer must publicly announce the nature of his or her interest before the vote and must file a memorandum of voting conflict on Ethics Commission Form 8B with the meeting's recording officer within 15 days after the vote occurs disclosing the nature of his or her interest in the matter."
- (89) Proxy Voting. Proxy voting is not permitted.

- (9<u>10</u>) Parliamentary Procedures. The Board will conduct business using parliamentary procedures according to Robert's Rules of Order, except when in conflict with these Bylaws.
- (1011) Attendance. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council shall review, and consider rescinding, the appointment of any voting member of the Board who fails to attend three consecutive meetings. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council shall notify the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged if any state agency voting member or their alternate fails to attend three consecutive meetings. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council shall notify the planning Council must maintain an attendance roster for each meeting. Board members can participate (and vote) at meetings via conference call, however, a physical quorum must be present to vote on action items.

H. Administration

- (1) Staff Support. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council shall provide the Board with sufficient staff support and resources to enable the Board to fulfill its responsibilities as set forth in Section 427.0157, Florida Statutes. These responsibilities include providing sufficient staff to manage and oversee the operations of the Board and assist in the scheduling of meetings, preparing meeting agenda packets and other necessary administrative duties as required by the Board within the limits of the resources available.
- (2) Minutes. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council is responsible for maintaining an official set of minutes for each Board meeting regardless of the presence of a quorum. The minutes shall be prepared in a reasonable time following the meeting and shall include an attendance roster indicating what agency, organization or position each member represents and reflect a summary of official actions taken by the Board. Meeting minutes shall be provided at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting for approval.

I. Duties

- (1) Board Duties. The following Board duties are set forth in Chapter 427, Florida Statutes and Rule 41-2, Florida Administrative Code.
 - (a) Maintain official meeting minutes, including an attendance roster, reflecting official actions and provide a copy of same to the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged.
 - (b) Review and approve the Memorandum of Agreement and Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan.

- (c) Annually evaluate the Community Transportation Coordinator's performance in general and relative to Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged and local standards as referenced in Rule 41-2.006, Florida Administrative Code, and the performance results of the most recent Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan. As part of the Community Transportation Coordinator's performance, the Board shall also set an annual percentage goal increase for the number of trips provided within the system for ridership on public transit, where applicable. In areas where the public transit is being utilized, the Board shall set an annual percentage of the number of trips to be provided on public transit. The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged shall provide evaluation criteria for the Board to use relative to the performance of the Community Transportation Coordinator. This evaluation shall be submitted to the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged upon approval by the Board.
- (d) In cooperation with the Community Transportation Coordinator, review all applications for local, state or federal funds relating to transportation of the transportation disadvantaged in the service area to ensure that any expenditures within the county are provided in the most cost effective and efficient manner.
- (e) Review coordination strategies for service provision to the transportation disadvantaged in the service area to seek innovative ways to improve cost effectiveness, efficiency, safety, working hours and types of service in an effort to increase ridership to a broader population. Such strategies should also encourage multi-county and regional transportation service agreements between area Community Transportation Coordinators and consolidation of adjacent counties when it is appropriate and cost effective to do so.
- (f) Working with the Community Transportation Coordinator, jointly develop applications for funds that may become available.
- (g) Assist the Community Transportation Coordinator in establishing trip priorities for trips that are purchased with Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Funds.
- (h) Annually review coordination contracts to advise the Community Transportation Coordinator whether the continuation of said contract provides the most cost effective and efficient transportation available.
- (i) Annually review all transportation operator contracts as to the effectiveness and efficiency of the transportation operator and recommend approval or disapproval of such contracts to the Community Transportation Coordinator.
- (j) Annually hold a public hearing workshop for the purpose of receiving input regarding unmet transportation needs or any other areas that relate to the local transportation services provided under Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged Program in Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Counties.
- (k) Annually review the Annual Operations Report.

J. Committees

The Chair subject to approval by the Board shall appoint a Grievance Committee to process and investigate complaints from agencies, users, transportation operators and potential users of the system in the designated service area. The Grievance Committee shall make recommendations to the Board or to the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged for improvement of service. The Board shall establish a process and procedures to provide regular opportunities for issues to be brought before the Grievance Committee and to address them in a timely manner. Rider brochures or other documents provided to users or potential users of the system shall provide information about the complaint and grievance process including the publishing of the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged Helpline service when local resolution has not occurred. When requested, all materials shall be made available in accessible format. Members appointed to the Grievance Committee shall be voting members of the Board. If a Grievant claims a conflict between the Grievant and a Grievance Committee member, the Grievance Committee member identified as having a conflict shall recuse themselves from hearing the grievance.

Additional committees shall be appointed by the Chair, subject to approval by the Board, as necessary to investigate and report on specific subject areas of interest to the Board and to deal with administrative and legislative procedures.

K. Amendments

These Bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of members present at regular meetings.

L. Certification

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Chapter I: Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board Grievance Procedures

A. Preamble

The following sets forth the procedures for the Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board to address grievances from agencies, users, potential users, subcontractors, and other interested parties concerning Florida's Coordinated Transportation System.

B. Agency Description

The Columbia, Hamilton and Suwannee Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board, herein after referred to as the Board, is a public body appointed by the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council serving as the Designated Official Planning Agency as authorized by Section 427.015, Florida Statutes.

C. Definitions

Transportation disadvantaged means those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation and are, therefore, dependent upon others to obtain access to health care, employment, education, shopping, social activities, or other life-sustaining activities, or children who are handicapped or high-risk or at-risk as defined in Section 411.202, Florida Statutes.

Agency means an official, officer, commission, authority, council, committee, department, division, bureau, board, section, or any other unit or entity of the state or of a city, town, municipality, county, or other local governing body or a private nonprofit transportation service-providing agency.

Community Transportation Coordinator means a transportation entity recommended by a metropolitan planning organization, or by the appropriate designated official planning agency as provided for in Section 427.011, Florida Statutes in an area outside the purview of a metropolitan planning organization, to ensure that coordinated transportation services are provided to the transportation disadvantaged population in a designated service area.

Coordinating Board means an advisory entity in each designated service area composed of representatives appointed by the metropolitan planning organization or designated official planning agency, to provide assistance to the community transportation coordinator relative to the coordination of transportation services.

Coordination means the arrangement for the provision of transportation services to the transportation disadvantaged in a manner that is cost-effective, efficient and reduces fragmentation and duplication of services.

Designated Official Planning Agency means the official body or agency designated by the Commission to fulfill the functions of transportation disadvantaged planning in areas not covered by a Metropolitan Planning Organization. The Metropolitan Planning Organization shall serve as the designated official planning agency in areas covered by such organizations.

Designated Service Area means a geographical area recommended by a designated official planning agency, subject to approval by the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged, which defines the community where coordinated transportation services will be provided to the transportation disadvantaged.

Florida's Coordinated Transportation System means a transportation system responsible for coordination and service provisions for the transportation disadvantaged as outlined in Chapter 427, Florida Statutes.

Grievance means a written complaint to document any concerns regarding the operation or administration of services provided by Florida's Coordinated Transportation System by the Community Transportation Coordinator, subcontracted transportation operators, the Designated Official Planning Agency, or the Board. A grievance may also be a service complaint that has been left unresolved for more than 45 days.

Memorandum of Agreement is the state contract for transportation disadvantaged services purchased with federal, state or local government transportation disadvantaged funds. This agreement is between the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged and the Community Transportation Coordinator and recognizes the Community Transportation Coordinator as being responsible for the arrangement of the provision of transportation disadvantaged services for a designated service area.

Service complaint means routine incidents that occur on a daily basis, are reported to the driver or dispatcher, or to other individuals involved with the daily operations, and are resolved within the course of a reasonable time period suitable to the complainant. All service complaints shall be recorded and a summary of complaints should be provided by the Community Transportation Coordinator on a quarterly basis, to the Board.

Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan means an annually updated plan jointly developed by the Designated Official Planning Agency and the Community Transportation Coordinator which contains a development plan, service plan and quality assurance components. The plan shall be approved and used by the local Coordinating Board to evaluate the Community Transportation Coordinator.

D. Purpose

- (1) The Board shall appoint a Grievance Committee to serve as a mediator to process, and investigate complaints from agencies, users, potential users of the system and the Community Transportation Coordinator in the designated service area, and make recommendations to the Board for the improvement of service.
- (2) The Board shall establish procedures to provide regular opportunities for issues to be brought before the Grievance Committee and to address them in a timely manner. Members appointed to the Grievance Committee shall be voting members of the Board.

(3) The Grievance Committee and the Board shall have the authority to hear and advise on grievances. When an entity makes a determination of the rights, duties, privileges, benefits, or legal relationships of a specified person or persons, it is exercising "adjudicative" or "determinative" powers. Deciding a grievance between two independent parties may fall within these parameters, depending on the nature of the grievance. Chapter 427, Florida Statutes grants no adjudicative powers to anyone.

E. Membership

- (1) The Chair, subject to approval by the Board, shall appoint five (5) voting members to a Grievance Committee. The membership of the Grievance Committee shall include broad geographic representation from members of the local Coordinating Board representing the counties in the service area.
- (2) Term limits on the Grievance Committee may coincide with term limits on the Board.

F. Officers

(1) Chair. The Chair shall be one of the local elected officials from Columbia, Hamilton or Suwannee Counties who is not serving as Chair or Vice-Chair of the Board. In the event the local elected official not serving as Chair or Vice-Chair of the Board does not wish to serve as Chair of the Grievance Committee, the Vice-Chair shall serve as Chair of the Grievance Committee. The Grievance Committee shall elect a Vice-Chair.

G. Meetings

- (1) The Grievance Committee may meet as often as necessary to fulfill their responsibilities. <u>Meetings may be called, rescheduled, postponed or cancelled for any appropriate purpose by the Chair as long as the procedure requirements stated in Section J. (9) and (10) are met. The Grievance Committee may meet following Board meetings to hear complaints. All meetings will function under the "Government in the Sunshine Law." All meetings will provide opportunity for public comments on the agenda.</u>
- (2) Notice of Meetings. Notices and tentative agendas shall be provided to the Florida Commission for the Transportation, Committee members and other interested parties at least two weeks prior to the meeting. Meeting notices shall include the date, time, location, general nature/subject of the meeting, a contact person and phone number to call for additional information and to request accessible formats.
- (3) Quorum. At all meetings of the Grievance Committee, the presence in person of a majority of the voting members shall be necessary and sufficient to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. In the absence of a quorum, those present may, without notice other than by announcement at the meeting, recess the meeting from time to time, until a quorum shall be present. At any such recessed meeting, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called.

- (4) Voting. A majority vote is required for actions by the Grievance Committee. As required by Section 286.012, Florida Statutes, all Grievance Committee members, including the Chair, must vote on all official actions taken by the Grievance Committee except when there appears to be a possible conflict of interest with a member or members of the Grievance Committee.
- (5) Conflict of Interest. In accordance with Chapter 112 (Part III), Florida Statutes, "No county, municipal, or other public office shall vote in an official capacity upon any measure which would inure to his or her special private gain or loss, or which the officer know would inure to the special private gain or loss of a principal by whom he or she is retained, of the parent organization or subsidiary of a corporate principal which he or she is retained, of a relative or of a business associate. The officer must publicly announce the nature of his or her interest before the vote and must file a memorandum of voting conflict on Ethics Commission Form 8B with the meeting's recording officer within 15 days after the vote occurs disclosing the nature of his or her interest in the matter."

In cases where a grievance involves the private or personal interests of a member of the Grievance Committee, such member shall be disqualified from hearing such grievance. If a Grievant claims a conflict between the Grievant and a Grievance Committee member, the Grievance Committee member identified as having a conflict shall recues themselves from hearing the grievance. No member of the Grievance Committee shall appear before the Grievance Committee as an agent or attorney for any person.

- (6) Proxy Voting. Proxy voting is not permitted.
- (7) Parliamentary Procedures. The Grievance Committee will conduct business using parliamentary procedures according to Robert's Rules of Order, except when in conflict with these Grievance Procedures.

H. Administration

- (1) Staff Support. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council shall provide the Grievance Committee with sufficient staff support and resources to enable the Grievance Committee to fulfill their responsibilities.
- (2) Minutes. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council is responsible for maintaining an official set of minutes for each Grievance Committee meeting.

I. Duties

The Grievance Committee shall make recommendations to the Board, the Community Transportation Coordinator, and/or to the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged for improvement of service.

J. Procedures

- (1) The grievance procedures shall be open to addressing concerns by any person or agency including but not limited to: purchasing agencies, users, potential users, private-for-profit operators, private-nonprofit operators, Community Transportation Coordinators, Designated Official Planning Agencies, elected officials, and drivers. The grievant, in their formal complaint, should demonstrate or establish their concerns as clearly as possible.
- (2) The Board must make a written copy of the grievance procedures available to anyone, upon request. All documents pertaining to the grievance process will be made available, upon request, in accessible format. The following procedures are established to provide regular opportunities for grievances to be brought before the Grievance Committee.
- (3) Should an interested party wish to file a grievance with the Board, that grievance must be filed in writing within ninety (90) days after the occurrence of the event giving rise to the grievance. The grievance shall be sent to:

- (4) If requested, the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council staff will provide assistance to individuals in preparing written grievances.
- (5) The grievance should try to demonstrate or establish a clear violation of a specific law, regulation, or contractual arrangement. Copies of pertinent laws and regulations may be obtained from North Central Florida Regional Planning Council staff.
- (6) The grievance shall include:

a. the name, address and telephone number of the Complainant;

b. a statement of the grounds for the grievance and be supplemented by supporting documentation, made in a clear and concise manner; and

c. an explanation by the Complainant of the improvements needed to address the complaint.

- (7) If the Board receives a grievance pertaining to the operation of services by the Community Transportation Coordinator, that grievance shall be forwarded to the Community Transportation Coordinator for a written response. The Community Transportation Coordinator's written response shall be provided to the Grievance Committee at least one week prior to the Grievance Committee meeting to hear such grievance.
- (8) If the Complainant does not want to be contacted by the Community Transportation Coordinator concerning the grievance before the grievance is heard, the Community Transportation Coordinator is prohibited from contacting the Complainant.

- (9) Within fifteen (15) working days following the date of receipt of the formal grievance, North Central Florida Regional Planning Council staff shall advise the Grievance Committee of the grievance to schedule a hearing on the grievance and inform the Complainant of the hearing date.
- (10) The Grievance Committee shall meet to hear the grievance within forty-five (45) calendar days from the date of receipt of the grievance.
- (11) North Central Florida Regional Planning Council staff shall send notice of the Grievance Committee's scheduled hearing in writing to the local newspaper of greatest circulation, the Complainant and other interested parties.
- (12) All involved parties have a right to present their views to the Grievance Committee, either orally or in writing. In addition, all parties may present evidence. The Community Transportation Coordinator shall provide transportation to and from Grievance Committee meetings at no charge to complainants who cannot transport themselves to the meetings.
- (13) A written report and any recommendations of the Grievance Committee shall be provided to the Board. A copy of this report shall be provided to the concerned parties within ten (10) working days after the hearing on the grievance and no more than sixty (60) calendar days from the date of receipt of the formal grievance. The Grievance Committee's recommendation will stand unless the recommendation is changed by the Board.
- (14) A written report shall also be provided to the Community Transportation Coordinator's Governing Board.

K. Appeals

(1) Appeals of recommendations by the Grievance Committee to the Board shall be made within twenty (20) working days from the date when the Grievance Committee makes a recommendation regarding a grievance. The appeal shall be mailed to:

- (2) The Complainant will be notified in writing of the date, time and place of the Board meeting where the appeal will be heard. This written notice will be mailed at least ten (10) calendar days in advance of the meeting.
- (3) The Board will meet to hear the appeal and render its recommendation within thirty (30) calendar days of the date the appeal was filed. A written copy of the recommendation will be mailed to all parties involved within ten (10) calendar days of the date of the recommendation.
- (4) Should a Complainant remain dissatisfied with the Board's decision, he or she may contact the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged at the following address:

- (5) The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged also has an Ombudsman Program to assist individuals with complaints. The toll-free Ombudsman Hotline is 1-800-983-2435. Chapter 427, Florida Statutes does not expressly confer the power or authority for the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged to "hear and determine" a grievance between two (2) third parties. The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged may choose to listen to grievances and it can investigate them from a fact-finding perspective. It cannot be the "judge" or "arbiter" of the grievance in the sense of determining that one party's version of the facts is right and the other is wrong, and order the wrong party to somehow compensate the right party. On the other hand, the grievance may bring to light a problem within "the system."
- (6) If the grievance showed that one (1) of the parties with whom the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged contracts was acting so aberrantly as to not be in compliance with its contract, the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged could exercise whatever contractual rights it has to correct the problem.
- (7) The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged may take part in the grievance process, if it wants to, for purposes of listening to the grieving parties and gathering the facts of the matter. It may not decide the grievance, where doing so would amount to an exercise of adjudicative powers.

L. Suspension Reconsideration

- (1) If a rider has been issued a notice of suspension by the Community Transportation Coordinator, they have ten (10) calendar days from the date of issuance of suspension notice to request a reconsideration hearing on the suspension. If a reconsideration hearing is requested, the hearing will be held by the Grievance Committee if the suspension involves transportation provided under Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged Program.
- (2) The written request must include the name, address and telephone number of the person who is requesting the hearing and a statement as to why his or her riding privileges should not be suspended. If the request is not received within ten (10) calendar days from the issue date of the suspension, then the suspension becomes effective ten (10) calendar days from the date of issue.
- (3) Upon receipt of letter requesting the reconsideration hearing, a hearing shall be held within ten (10) working days. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council will advise the person requesting the reconsideration hearing by return correspondence of the date, time and location of the hearing.
- (4) The suspended rider will be given the opportunity to present the reasons why they believe the suspension should not take place. The Grievance Committee will make a recommendation whether or not to uphold the suspension. A written statement of the decision whether or not to uphold the suspension shall be forwarded by certified mail within two (2) working days by the Community Transportation Coordinator to the suspended rider requesting the reconsideration.

M. Prohibition Against Retaliation

The Community Transportation Coordinator shall not take any punitive action against an individual who files a grievance. No individual shall be denied Transportation Disadvantaged Program services because such individual has filed a grievance related to Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged Program or has testified or is about to testify in any such proceeding or investigation related to Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged Program.

N. Alternative Recourse

Apart from these grievance processes, aggrieved parties with proper standing, may also have recourse through Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, administrative hearings process or the judicial court system.

O. Certification



SCOPE

Who:

The Suwannee Valley Transit Authority will utilize the equipment requested in this application to maintain transportation operations in its service to the following clients: transportation disadvantaged, elderly, disabled, frail elderly, Medicaid transportation eligible, veterans, persons who need a payer of last resort, and the general public on a space available basis in the rural areas of the three counties in the inter-local agreement (Columbia, Hamilton, and Suwannee). Columbia County is 801 square miles with a population of 67,543 people. Hamilton County is 519 square miles and has a population of 14,354 people. Suwannee County is 692 square miles and has a population of 43,734 people.

What:

Suwannee Valley Transit Authority does well with an aging fleet. Our goal is to replace vehicles that have more than 150,000 miles through the grant process such as the Shirley Conroy Grant. Our need is not only for the larger vehicles. The agency has slowly been replacing smaller vehicles in our fleet to meet the demand for the three rural counties that we serve.

The first priority on our request this year is a twenty-four (24) foot Gasoline Cutaway with wheelchair lift. A review of our current inventory list will show the Committee that we still have cutaways with many miles on them. We have been able to replace some of the cutaways through the grant process for the Shirley Conroy Grant, FDOT 5310 Grant, FDOT 5339 Grant, and the Transportation Disadvantaged program. We are very thankful for these grants because in the past year we have needed a lot of repairs on our aged cutaways. Hopefully within this next grant cycle for the 2016-2017 year, we will have met our goal and will not have to worry about vehicles breaking down with passengers on board.

The second priority on our list this year is a 2017 Dodge Caravan. Suwannee Valley Transit Authority currently has one minivan and three MV1's that are used when we transport small groups. Adding one more minivan to our fleet would complete our need for the smaller vehicles.

Where:

Suwannee Valley Transit Authority is designated as the Community Transportation Coordinator for Columbia, Hamilton, and Suwannee Counties. We contract with the Commission to transport clients under the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund. The cutaway and the minivan would be used in our service to these three counties. As previously stated, Suwannee Valley Transit Authority covers a total of 2,012 square miles and a population of 125,631 people are served between the three counties.

When:

Orders for all equipment awarded under this grant will be placed by the Administrator as soon as the grant agreement between the agency and the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged is executed. All equipment will be in the agency's possession on or before June 30, 2016.

How:

The cutaway will be purchased through Alliance Bus Group using the state procurement system. We have an application with a mark-up based on the information that we received from Alliance Bus Group about how the price will have changed by the time we place this order.

The van will be purchased from David Clemmons at North Tampa Chrysler, Jeep and Dodge using the state procurement system.

<u>Why</u>:

Suwannee Valley Transit Authority is the CTC for Columbia, Hamilton, and Suwannee Counties. We transport the transportation disadvantaged under the Transportation Disadvantaged Grant Agreement. We transport patients to various appointments such as dialysis and to the doctor's office. We also do shopping trips. Suwannee Valley Transit Authority is a vital part of the three communities that we serve because we provide residents with life sustaining transportation they would otherwise not have. Suwannee Valley Transit Authority was formed in 1976. During the forty (40) years that we have been in service, we have served many citizens of our three counties.

Without grants, Suwannee Valley Transit Authority would not be able to replace the aging fleet. We have an excellent maintenance team that keeps our vehicles going in spite of the high number of miles on our fleet. The team at Suwannee Valley Transit Authority does everything within our control to ensure that passengers get to their appointments on time and safely. We would like to take advantage of every opportunity that we can to replace aged vehicles. We know that we have the citizens of our three counties at heart when we go about our daily operations at Suwannee Valley Transit Authority.

Status of 2014/2015 and 2015/2016 Grants:

Through the Shirley Conroy Grant in the 2014/2015 year, Suwannee Valley Transit Authority was able to purchase twelve camera units for vehicles that did not have cameras installed. Having the cameras in the vehicles help with training and documenting incidents and accidents. We can review our drivers while they are transporting clients to see where and what training should be implemented next. It is our goal to improve the service that we offer our clients so we review the videos often for feedback. If an incident or accident occurs, we have the video so that the instance is properly documented.

Through the Shirley Conroy Grant for 2015/2016, Suwannee Valley Transit Authority was able to replace two aged vehicles with a twenty-four (24) foot cutaway and a minivan. Both vehicles were right on time. We use the minivan to transport smaller trips that require more room than we have on the MV1. The cutaway is in service with our Jasper Meal Site. Both vehicles allow us get our clients where they need to be in a safe and timely manner. We do not have to worry about breakdowns as much as our aging fleet is replaced.
