

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Levy County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan amendments.

BACKGROUND

Projects selected for funding under Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act programs must be derived from a Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan. The Plan must be developed through a process that includes representatives of public, private, and nonprofit transportation and human services providers and participation by the public.

In addition, according to the Florida Administrative Code 41-2.011(6):

"In cooperation with the local Coordinating Board, the Community Transportation Coordinator shall review all applications for local government, federal and state transportation disadvantaged funds submitted from or planned for use in their designated service area."

Attached are draft amendments to the Levy County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan that meet the Federal and State requirements. Also, attached are Levy County Transit's applications for U.S.C. Section 5311 and 5339 grant funds.

3. Barriers to Coordination

Medicaid non-emergency transportation services are no longer coordinated through Florida's Coordinated Transportation System in Levy County. In May 2014, the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration implemented Florida's Managed Medical Care Program. The Managed Medical Care Program requires Managed Medical Assistance Plans to provide transportation to their enrollees who have no other means of transportation available.

The Managed Medical Assistance Plans provide transportation services directly through their own network of transportation providers. According Chapter 2 of the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration Transportation Coverage, Limitations and Reimbursement Handbook, July 1997, "Medicaid is required by Chapter 427, Florida Statues to purchase transportation services through the designated Community Transportation Coordinator, unless those services are not cost effective or the Community Transportation Coordinator does not coordinate Medicaid transportation services."

Other barriers to the coordination of transportation services in Levy County include the following:

- low density, rural population limiting ability to group trips while maintaining an acceptable level of service;
- limited availability of medical services/facilities in county necessitating out-of-county trips;
- differing agency requirements for client transportation services (e.g., maximum allowable "ready to go" window); and
- cost, insurance and safety standard concerns relating to the use of public school vehicles do not meet safety standards and are difficult to insure on a temporary basis.

Current System Description


Levy County Transit is a County Agency under the direction of the Levy County Board of County Commissioners and is the CTC (Community Transportation Coordinator) for the County.


Levy County Transit provides transportation service to the general public within the County. The services include taking passengers into surrounding counties/cities to better serve the citizens of the county.


Levy County is predominately rural and has a land mass of approximately 1118 square miles with an estimate population of 39,832. This information come from the United States Census Bureau.

- The mission and goals of this agency are to provide transportation to individuals that are in need of a safe, reliable and professional service to and from destinations to increase the quality of their lives in one way or another. Daily strides are taken to meet or exceed the expectations of the citizens who use transportation. Efforts are made continually to bring awareness to the services provided by this agency and seek ways to increase ridership.
- 2. Levy County Board of County Commissioners is the governing board of this agency. All grant applications, service agreements or purchasing of capital equipment must be approved by the Board prior to any action taken by Levy County Transit. All services provided are door to door demand response, meeting ADA guidelines including wheelchair and stretcher trips. Currently there are 12 full time and one part time employee.
- 3. Levy County BOCC carries all insurance for the agency and vehicles. The Director is responsible for training, managing and administration of the transportation program. Trainings offered are attended when possible for certifications that will assist in training of new hires and refresher trainings for current employees. All training provided follow the guidelines of Chapter427, Rule Chapter 14-90 and compliance of the System Safety Program Plan. Driver's hold CDL with passenger endorsement, have passed DOT physical and First aid/CPR Training. Office staff are qualified to drive, as most drive on a daily basis.
- 4. Levy County Transit has a mechanic that is dedicated to the transportation fleet on a daily basis. In the event that the mechanic is out and repairs are needed on a vehicle, a county mechanic will respond to the need. Occasional repairs arise that must be outsourced so quotes are received for those repairs. All preventive maintenance services and annual inspections are performed at the county maintenance facility. Only major repairs such as engine work, transmissions or body work get out sourced.
- 5. Of the 12 current employees there are 7 F/T drivers and one P/T driver however the scheduler, dispatcher, office manager drive daily with the Director driving as needed. The

- mechanic is the only employee that does not drive. A shortage of drivers has been an ongoing issue for almost two years but efforts continue to hire qualified drivers.
- 6. Levy County Transit provides 9 dedicated runs in the a.m. Those runs are returned in the afternoon. All other trips are scheduled within and around the dedicated runs. 40847 trips were provided for the period of October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2016. Of the 40847 trips provided 11,859 were provided for the elderly and or disabled population. During this period 624,445 miles were driven with 533,878 being revenue miles.

Section 5311 Operating

- 1. The goal for using 5311 operating funds is to continue with existing services and increase service to more Levy County citizens in need of transportation. The operating funds will be used to invoice salaries, wages and benefits to assist with expenditures related to transit employees. Hours of operation for drivers will continue to be from around 4:30 a.m. until approximately 19:00 hours Monday Friday. Each run requires a driver to leave at different times of the morning and last bus at the end of the day may arrive as late as 19:00. The last run of the day is the return of dialysis riders.
- 2. Without 5311 funding to offset the expense of providing transportation, Levy County Transit would be unable to provide many of the trips. This funding is vital to this county for transportation of citizens in need. Financial records will be maintained by both the Levy County finance office and Levy County Transit. All maintenance, operating, and required reporting documents are kept and maintained at the Levy County Transit office which pertain to any and all reporting guidelines required through FTA and FDOT.

- 7. Levy County Transit is a government authority operating under the Levy County Board of County Commissioners. Service is provided Monday Friday for the general public of Levy County. Trips are provided into surrounding areas outside of Levy County to meet the needs of the riders. Areas outside of the county include Trenton, Newberry, Gainesville, Archer, Crystal River, Dunnellon and Lecanto. The county has an employee union, Northeast Florida Public Employee's Local 630; however no employee of Levy County Transit is a member.
- 8. N/A
- 9. a. The office hours for Levy County Transit are currently 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.; however the Local Coordinating Board will be voting on reducing office hours to help reduce costs. Service hours for riders will remain the same beginning around 4:30 a.m. and ending around 19:00. The daily scheduled routes provide transportation from all areas in Levy County into cities within the county as well as cities outside the county. Trips being provided are for life sustaining, medical, training, employment, shopping, visitation, recreation, school and miscellaneous purposes.
 - b. During the past year strides have been made to fill driving positions that have been vacant with little luck. Efforts will continue on an ongoing basis until positions are filled. Office staff are currently filling these positions to provide all trips. As positions are filled,

training is in depth with over 40 hours of classroom and at least 40 hours of hands on training that includes riding with and assisting current drivers, assisting riders, customer service, wheelchair lift and securement, stretcher securement, per trip/post trip inspections, use of tablet and any paperwork that is the responsibility of the driver.

- c. Records maintenance is kept in house for all information pertaining to trips, daily vehicle inspection, accidents/incidents, System Safety Program Plan, Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan, Hazard Safety Plan, and all grants reimbursements.
- d. The agency mechanic performs and produces work orders for any and all maintenance on buses. Repairs and maintenance are done daily at the county's maintenance facility. This agency has older buses that are used when maintenance is scheduled to prevent service interruptions.
- e. It is the goal for all employees hired for driving positions to possess a CDL Class C or above with passenger endorsement within 6 months of their hire date. The requirement is a CDL and passenger endorsement. The vehicles at this agency only require a Class C with passenger endorsement for buses with seating capacity of 16 or more. The majority of the fleet have less than 16 seats.
- f. The System Safety Program Plan is updated on a yearly basis and is available upon request. New employees are given a copy and the plan is discussed during training. g. Levy County Transit is a Zero Tolerance Drug Free Workplace. Prior to job offering the applicant must pass a pre-employment drug screen. All employees are on a random list that is produced quarterly by First Lab for drug or drug and alcohol testing.
- 10. This agency is funded with Transportation Disadvantaged grant funds, Med-waiver, fare box, Suwannee River Economic Council funding, advertisement, miscellaneous funds (i.e.; reduced fare trips for those who do not qualify for state or federal funding), and county funds. 5311 funds are an important source for reimbursement of operating costs for this agency.
- 11. Levy County has the funds for the 50% match for this 5311 grant with the Trip & Equipment Grant through the Transportation Disadvantaged Commission.

WHEREAS, PURCHASER is desirous of purchasing transportation services for those people 60+ years of age or older who need assistance to doctor's office, shopping, and other trips, and also being transported to congregate mealsites, who are living in <u>Levy County</u>; and

WHEREAS, the PROVIDER has the equipment and personnel to supply such transportation;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto, intending to be legally bound hereby agrees as follows:

- PURCHASER shall pay PROVIDER the rate of \$17.57 per trip provided, with a not-to-exceed 710 Units total amount of \$12,474.70 for the term of the Agreement. PURCHASER shall comply with any reasonable requirements of PROVIDER in requesting such trips. PROVIDER shall provide trips requested that meet PROVIDERS reasonable requirements, up to the not-to-exceed amount.
- 2. THIS AGREEMENT shall be effective as of January 1, 2016, and shall be in force with respect to transportation provided during the period commencing on the effective date and ending December 31, 2016, and during such additional period or periods as the PROVIDER and PURCHASER may agree upon. EXHIBIT A

Current System Description

Levy County Transit is a County Agency under the direction of the Levy County Board of County Commissioners and is the CTC (Community Transportation Coordinator) for the County.

Levy County Transit provides transportation services to the general public within the County. The services include taking passengers into surrounding counties/cities to better serve the citizens of the county.

Levy County is predominantly rural and has a land mass of approximately 1,118 square miles with an estimate population of 39,832. This information comes from the United States Census Bureau.

- 1. The mission and goals of this agency are to provide transportation to individuals that are in need of a safe, reliable and professional service to and from destinations to increase the quality of their lives in one way or another. Daily strides are taken to meet or exceed the expectations of the citizens who use transportation. Efforts are made continually to bring awareness to the services provided and seek ways to increase ridership through participation with local outreach agencies and involvement with Levy County Agency for Retarded Citizens, (LARC) fund raisers.
- 2. Levy County Board of County Commissioners (Board) is the governing board of this agency. All grant applications, service agreements or purchasing of capital equipment must be approved by the Board prior to any action taken by Levy County Transit. All services provided are door to door demand response, meeting ADA guidelines including wheelchair and stretcher trips. Currently there are 12 full time and one part time employees. There are no volunteers.
- 3. The Board carries all insurance for the agency and vehicles. The Director is responsible for training, managing and administration of the transportation program. Training programs offered are attended when possible for certifications that will assist in training of new hires and refresher trainings for current employees. All training provided follows the guidelines of Chapter427, Fla.Stat. FAC Rule Chapter 14-90 and compliance with the System Safety Program Plan. Drivers hold CDLs with passenger endorsements, have passed DOT physicals and First aid/CPR Training. Office staff are qualified to drive, as most drive on a daily basis.
- 4. Levy County Transit has a mechanic that is dedicated to the transportation fleet on a daily basis. In the event that the mechanic is out and repairs are needed on a vehicle, a county mechanic will respond to the need. Occasional repairs arise that must be outsourced so quotes are received for those repairs. All preventive maintenance services and annual inspections are performed at the county maintenance facility. Only major repairs such as engine work, transmissions or body work get out sourced.

- 5. Of the 12 current employees there are seven full time drivers and one part time driver; however the scheduler, dispatcher, and office manager drive daily with the Director driving as needed. The mechanic is the only employee that does not drive. A shortage of drivers has been an ongoing issue for almost two years but efforts continue to hire qualified drivers.
- 6. Levy County Transit provides demand response, door to door service to all areas within the County. There are nine dedicated runs in the mornings to cover dialysis, ARC trips and two private schools (school trips are open to the general public and not just dedicated to school). All other trips are scheduled within and around the dedicated runs for efficiency. During the period of October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2016 there were 40,847 trips were provided. Of the 40,487 trips, 11,859 were provided for the elderly and or disabled population. During this period 624,445 miles were driven with 533,878 being revenue miles.

EXHIBIT B

Proposed Project Description

Section 5339 Capital Assistance

- 1. This project is a request for two smaller buses with wheelchair accessibility. Each bus will accommodate eight ambulatory riders or four ambulatory and one wheelchair or scooter. These buses will provide more efficient service than the current older buses.
- 2. Daily trips are being provided in ten para-transit buses with only two spares. These buses will be put into the front line while two older buses, a 2009 and 2010 with in excess of 300,000 miles each, will be moved into reserve/backup fleet. The new buses will help in reducing operational costs by using less fuel and savings on repairs that are now being spent to maintain the older buses. The two older buses are only getting seven miles to the gallon while the new buses will provide more efficient fuel mileage.
- 3. Several buses have been removed from the fleet due to significant increases in repairs and maintenance to keep them on the road. With the County having such a large area to provide service with many trips to out-laying counties, it is not unusual for buses to be driven in excess of 300 miles per day.
- 4. See current vehicle inventory with this grant application.
- 5. Primarily all maintenance and repairs are done by the transit mechanic at the County maintenance facility. Service is performed at 5000 mile intervals with yearly inspections due beginning in November through December of each year. For repairs that must be out sourced, quotes are received from vendors and lowest quotes are usually chosen unless distance to repair shop is further or if repairs cannot be completed in a timely manner. The mechanic is available Monday thru Friday 6:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. for his normal working hours however, he is available in the event he is needed for mechanical issues on a bus prior to his clock in and out time each day or during weekend service due to holidays. County mechanics are available for repairs when the transit mechanic is on annual or sick leave.
- **6.** Levy County is the Community Transportation Coordinator providing transportation to all residents in Levy County. Demand Response, door to door service is provided to meet or exceed ADA compliance.
- 7. Hours of operation begin at 3:30 a.m. and end upon completion with the last rider being returned home at the end of the day, usually by 7:00 p.m. Current office hours are 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday thru Friday. As of January 1, 2017 office hours will be changed to 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. to help lower operational costs. This change will not affect the current service hours.
- **8.** All employees including office staff are qualified to drive and provide transportation services. Each employee hired as a driver will within six months hold a Class "C" or

higher CDL with passenger endorsement to be qualified to drive larger buses with in excess of 16 or more passengers. DOT physicals are maintained by Levy County Transit. Refresher training is provided for all employees throughout the year. Record retention is primarily through scanning of documentation; however, some documentation is kept in original form in locked file cabinets. Vehicle maintenance files are kept in house and in the office at the County maintenance facility.

The System Safety Program Plan is updated annually or as needed and all requirements for a Drug Free Work Place are met and handled by the Drug and Alcohol Program Manager, the Director of Levy County Transit. The agency is current will all program requirements.


