

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Recommend the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged designate Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc. as the Lafayette County Community Transportation Coordinator for a five-year period effective July 1, 2018.

#### BACKGROUND:

The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council is the Designated Official Planning Agency for the Transportation Disadvantaged Program for Lafayette County. The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged requires that the designated official planning agencies conduct the selection process and recommend a Community Transportation Coordinator at the end of each contract period.

Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc. is the designated Community Transportation Coordinator for Lafayette County. Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc.'s Memorandum of Agreement will expire June 30, 2018.

The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council issued Request for Proposals No 2018-01 for Lafayette County Community Transportation Coordinator designation on January 4, 2018. Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc. submitted a proposal in response to the request for proposals.

The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council authorized the Executive Director to appoint a Technical Review Committee to review and score proposals for the Lafayette County Community Transportation Coordinator. The Technical Review Committee reviewed Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc.'s proposal and determined that it is responsive to the request for proposals. Therefore, it is recommended that Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc. be designated the Community Transportation Coordinator for Lafayette County for a five-year period effective July 1, 2018.

The Lafayette County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan serves as the Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan for Lafayette County. In addition, Florida Administrative Code 41-2.011(6) requires the Board to review all applications for local, state and federal government funded transportation projects planned in Lafayette County.

Attached are draft amendments to the Lafayette County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan that meet the federal and state requirements. Also, attached are applications for U.S.C. Section 5311 and 5339 grant funds for Board review.

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#### 3. Barriers to Coordination

Medicaid non-emergency transportation services are no longer coordinated through Florida's Coordinated Transportation System in Lafayette County. In May 2014, the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration implemented Florida's Managed Medical Care Program. The Managed Medical Care Program requires Managed Medical Assistance Plans to provide transportation to their enrollees who have no other means of transportation available.

The Managed Medical Assistance Plans provide transportation services directly through their own network of transportation providers. According Chapter 2 of the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration Transportation Coverage, Limitations and Reimbursement Handbook, July 1997, "Medicaid is required by Chapter 427, Florida Statues to purchase transportation services through the designated Community Transportation Coordinator, unless those services are not cost effective or the Community Transportation Coordinator does not coordinate Medicaid transportation services."

Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc. is a non-profit organization chartered in 1964 whose purpose is to provide services to low income and elderly citizens to alleviate poverty. SREC, Inc. currently is the state designated transportation provider in five rural, North Florida counties including Bradford, Dixie, Gilchrist, Lafayette, and Union. A voluntary Board of Directors governs SREC, Inc. The Board employs an Executive Director who has normal CEO responsibilities with the agency and the many programs it administers. SREC, Inc. has four Program Directors providing direct supervision of the ongoing programs, including Transportation.

Organizational structure: As the Community Transportation Coordinator for five (5) rural counties in North Florida SREC, Inc. operates partial brokerages with all trips provided by SREC, Inc. The exception to this is stretcher services which are contracted to a local government provider. SREC, Inc. provides mainly demand response services and requires 24-hour notice for trip requests. SREC, Inc.'s Executive Director has direct oversight of the Director of Transportation, who in turn manages the Transportation Department. Currently SREC, Inc. employs approximately 22 employees in the Transportation Department across the five service countles.

(c) Who is responsible for insurance, training, management, and administration of the agency's transportation programs? (Maximum 100 words)

To train drivers SREC, Inc. uses the FDOT approved computer testing and training modules, the online substance abuse training provided by CUTR, and personal hands-on training provided by CTAA PASS certified trainers employed by SREC, Inc. Administrative aspects of the Transportation Department, including but not limited to fleet inventory and maintenance, driver credentialing, Insurance tracking, and record keeping are led by the Director of Transportation.

(d) How are the operations of the transportation program currently funded? What are the sources of the funding (e.g., state, local, federal, private foundations, fares, other program fees?)? (Maximum 200 words)

Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc. utilizes a combination of funding sources including Section 5311, Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged, and Medicaid.

- Records maintenance: Administrative aspects of the Transportation Department, Including but not limited to fleet inventory and maintenance, driver credentialing, insurance tracking, and record keeping are led by the Director of Transportation.
- Vehicle maintenance: All maintenance is performed by private contractors for service. SREC, Inc. has no mechanics on staff. The current SSPP requires safety inspections to be performed every 5,000 miles. The checklist used by the mechanics is a FDOT approved checklist. Annual Inspections are performed annually and general maintenance is performed as needed if the driver reports an issue during the required daily inspection or if the vehicle has a mechanical failure.

- SSPP: See Attachment 2, Bus Transit System Annual Safety and Security Certification.
- Drug-free workplace: See Attachment 3, Certificate of Compliant for anti-drug and alcohol misuse prevention program.
- Data collection: SREC, Inc. utilizes the Trip Master transit management software for the transportation program. The ParaScope application connects the drivers on the road with the dispatchers in the office, and displays the driver's trip manifest electronically. The trip information is updated in real time, and data such as pickup and dropoff odometers and times are captured immediately.

The requested 5311 funding should help maintain the existing levels of service currently being provided by continuing to offset the cost of services by providing necessary operating funding assistance. Due to the rural nature of Lafayette County, trip lengths are increased due to minimal medical facilities. Therefore costs also increase. However, with local governments providing limited local resources and the continued reductions in the state Medicaid allocation as well as reduction in the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Funds, the 5311 program funds fill the gap and allow for transportation services to be provided in rural areas like Lafayette County. Thus, the requested 5311 funding helps offset the cost of the entire transportation system and allows for continued transportation services to be provided to those in need in Lafayette County.

The funding requested from Section 5311 will enable SREC, Inc. to continue tracking efficiency within the transportation system and maintain detailed recording and reporting throughout the program.

SREC, Inc. has four Program Directors providing direct supervision of the ongoing programs, including Transportation.



Current services that will be continued with the award of this grant include transporting residents of Lafayette County to area counties such as Alachua, Leon, Suwannee, and Columbia. Since there are limited medical facilities in this rural area trips to cities as far away as Tallahassee and Gainesville are required. Since Gainesville and Tallahassee both are 65 miles away, riders can normally expect a ride length of almost two hours due to traffic and stops picking up other passengers. Also, current services allow for Kidney Dialysis riders the opportunity for transport to and from their dialysis appointments in neighboring Columbia and Suwannee County. Those passengers are currently transported six (6) days per week. In addition, current services include transporting elderly clients to meal sites for lunch and health education. These trips occur five days per week in Lafayette County. These are some examples of the numerous services provided by SREC, Inc. and its transportation programs.

The grant will be used to add a much-needed, larger vehicle. The grant process is normally 12 – 15 months from when the application is made until the vehicle is delivered. Therefore, the inventory vehicle miles have to be projected 15 months ahead to show the age and mileage of the vehicles.

All maintenance is performed by private contractors for service. SREC, Inc. has no mechanics on staff. The current SSPP requires safety inspections to be performed every 5,000 miles. The checklist used by the mechanics is a FDOT approved checklist. Annual Inspections are performed annually and general maintenance is performed as needed if the driver reports an issue during the required daily inspection or if the vehicle has a mechanical failure.

All drivers employed by SREC, Inc. are in full compliance with FDOT regulations. Since all transit vehicles in the SREC, Inc. fleet are unqualified for CDL requirements, none of the drivers are required to carry a CDL. SREC, Inc. currently employs three (1) fulltime driver and four (4) on-call drivers in Lafayette County.


