


MEETING NOTICE CLEARINGHOUSE COMMITTEE

Chair Haas called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m.

SANTAFE VILLAGE DRI SUBSTANTIAL DEVIATION

Mr. Dopp stated that Council staff had identified August 18, August 24, and August 25, 2010 as potential Committee meeting dates for review of the DRI Substantial Deviation. Mr. Dopp requested that the Committee select a meeting date. The Committee agreed by consensus to meet on August 18, 2010.

I. APPROVAL OF THE JUNE 24, 2010 MEETING MINUTES

ACTION: It was moved by Mr. Smith and seconded by Commissioner Spooner to approve the June 24, 2010 minutes as circulated. The motion carried unanimously.

II. COMMITTEE-LEVEL REVIEW ITEMS

#101 - City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan Draft Amendments (DCA No. 10-1) #111 - Alachua County Comprehensive Plan Draft Amendments (DCA No. 10-1)

Mr. Dopp stated that these two local government comprehensive plan amendments were received by the Council after mailing out the Committee meeting package and have response deadlines which occur prior to the next Council meeting. Mr. Dopp asked the Committee to add these items to the agenda.

ACTION: It was moved by Mr. Smith and seconded by Commissioner Hawkins to add Clearinghouse Item #101, City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan Draft Amendments (DCA No. 10-1), and Clearinghouse Item #111, Alachua County Comprehensive Plan Draft Amendments (DCA No. 10-1), to the agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

- #99 City of High Springs Comprehensive Plan Adopted Amendment (DCA No. 10-1)
- #100 Columbia County Comprehensive Plan Adopted Amendment DCA No 10-1)
- #104 City of Live Oak Comprehensive Plan Adopted Amendments (DCA No. 10-1)
- #105 Taylor County Comprehensive Plan Adopted Evaluation and Appraisal Report-based Amendments (DCA No. 09-EAR1)
- #108 Gilchrist County Comprehensive Plan Adopted Amendment (DCA No. 10-1)

The Committee agreed by consensus to group these items for purposes of Clearinghouse Committee review. Mr. Dopp stated that the staff reports for the adopted amendments find the local government comprehensive plans, as amended, remain consistent with the regional plan. Mr. Dopp further stated that the staff report for the Columbia County item contains two objections and one recommendation concerning potential adverse impacts to segments of the Regional Road Network. Mr. Dopp also noted that a Development of Regional Impact application has been filed with the Council for some of the property addressed by the Taylor County item. He stated that the staff report for the Taylor County item notes that the Council evaluation of the Development of Regional Impact may reach different findings and conclusions than contained in the staff report for this Comprehensive Plan amendment.

ACTION: It was moved by Mr. Smith and seconded by Commissioner Spooner to approve the staff report as circulated. The motion

carried unanimously.

#102 - City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan Draft Amendments (DCA No. 10-1)

#107 - City of Madison Comprehensive Plan Draft Amendment (DCA No. 10-1)

#111 - Alachua County Comprehensive Plan Draft Amendments (DCA No. 10-1)

The Committee agreed by consensus to group these items for purposes of Clearinghouse Committee review. Mr. Dopp stated that the staff reports for the draft amendments find the local government comprehensive plans, if amended as proposed, will remain consistent with the regional plan. Mr. Dopp noted that the Alachua County item addresses properties which may be either a Development of Regional Impact or a Substantial Deviation to an existing Development of Regional Impact. He further stated that the staff report for the Alachua County item notes that the Council evaluation of the Development of Regional Impact and/or the Substantial Deviation to an existing Development of Regional Impact located on the subject property may reach different findings and conclusions than contained in the staff report for the Comprehensive Plan amendment.

ACTION: It was moved by Commissioner Thomas and seconded by Mr. Smith to approve the staff reports as circulated. The motion carried unanimously.

#102 - Gilchrist County Adopted Evaluation and Appraisal Report

Mr. Dopp stated that the staff report finds the County Comprehensive Plan, if amended as recommended by the draft Evaluation and Appraisal Report, is anticipated to remain consistent with the North Central Florida Strategic Regional Policy Plan; however, the Council may reach different conclusions for the specific comprehensive plan amendments contained as part of any evaluation and appraisal report-based amendments.

ACTION: It was moved by Commissioner Spooner and seconded by Commissioner Hawkins to approve the staff report as circulated. The motion carried unanimously.
