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# Introduction

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# Introduction

### A. Unified Planning Work Program - Defined

The Fiscal Years 2018-19 and 2019-20 Unified Planning Work Program for the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area outlines and describes the planning efforts to be undertaken by participating agencies to maintain a comprehensive, cooperative and continuing transportation planning program in the Gainesville Metropolitan Area. The Gainesville Metropolitan Area is comprised of the Year 2010 United States Census Gainesville Urbanized Area and a transitioning area that extends to the City of Gainesville Urban Reserve Boundary. The Gainesville Urbanized Area includes a major portion of the City of Gainesville, a small portion of the City of Alachua and contiguous urbanized portions of unincorporated Alachua County. The transitioning area includes portions of unincorporated Alachua County. The transitioning area includes portions of unincorporated Alachua County. Illustration I shows the Gainesville Metropolitan Area.


This Unified Planning Work Program has been prepared to define the tasks and anticipated funding requirements of the Gainesville Metropolitan Area transportation planning process for Fiscal Year 2018-19 and Fiscal Year 2019-20. This document serves to inform the public and all public officials and agencies, who contribute manpower and allocate funds to the transportation planning process, about all of the transportation planning tasks currently being conducted in the Gainesville Metropolitan Area. In addition, the Unified Planning Work Program provides the basis for federal funding of transportation planning activities identified in the document.

Transportation planning in the Gainesville Metropolitan Area is currently guided by a long-range transportation plan using input from public officials, technical experts and local citizens. State and federal governments participate in this planning process through the Florida Department of Transportation, the Federal Highway Administration, the Federal Aviation Administration and the Federal Transit Administration. The metropolitan area transportation planning process is administered by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area. Voting members of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area include the Gainesville Mayor and City Commissioners, and the Alachua County Commissioners. Non-voting members include the Florida Department of Transportation, the University of Florida and a Rural Advisor selected by the Alachua County League of Cities. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council provides staff services pursuant to a professional staff services agreement to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area.

### B. Overview of Local and Regional Comprehensive Transportation Planning Activities

Local and regional comprehensive transportation planning activities are currently underway in the Gainesville Metropolitan Area. Both the City of Gainesville and Alachua County have adopted comprehensive plans. In addition, the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council has an adopted strategic regional policy plan and the University of Florida has an adopted campus master plan. All of these plans are updated on a periodic basis. These local and regional planning programs are incorporated into the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area planning program. This is primarily accomplished through the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Technical Advisory Committee. The City of Gainesville, Alachua County, Florida Department of Transportation, Gainesville/Alachua County Regional Airport Authority, School Board of Alachua County and University of Florida representatives are all members of this Committee.

### C. Justification for the Level of Planning Effort Designated in the Unified Planning Work Program

The work tasks included in this document are those necessary to meet the transportation planning needs of the Gainesville Metropolitan Area. These work tasks are also required to maintain a level of proficiency necessary for continued certification by the federal agencies involved. Certification of the transportation planning process for the area is required for eligibility to receive federal funds to implement transportation projects.

### 1. Planning Priorities Facing the Metropolitan Planning Area

• an effective Public Involvement Process that involves citizens in the transportation planning process

- an accurate Transportation Improvement Program that informs the public concerning proposed transportation projects that will be implemented over the next several years
- updated land use and socioeconomic information that supports the long-range transportation planning models
- updated level of service and mobility plan information concerning traffic congestion
- an annual review of the long-range transportation plan to identify needed revisions
- updating the long-range transportation plan every five years
- the need for transit planning to support the Regional Transit System
- the development of bicycle and pedestrian plans
- development of additional effective modeling systems that view transit, pedestrian and bicycling activities as viable modes of transportation
- identification of tasks that Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area will perform with regard to implementation of Florida Department of Transportation Efficient Transportation Decision-Making process
- development of future year socioeconomic information by traffic analysis zone
- developing priorities for projects that are needed, but not currently funded
- development of a level of service assessment tool to identify needed safety projects
- implementation of enhanced transit service
- better connect people and destinations
- increase economic vitality and community livability
- develop a sustainable transportation system
- increase safety and security of the transportation system
- reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- development, implementation and evaluation of performance measures in support of the transportation planning process

### 2. Planning Tasks - Title 23 United States Code and Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations

The Unified Planning Work Program includes the following eight planning tasks to be performed under Title 23 United States Code and 49 United States Code, Section 53:

### 3. Public Involvement Process

This Unified Planning Work Program was developed by involving the public and other transportation agencies. Planning tasks included in this Unified Planning Work Program were reviewed by the Citizens Advisory Committee on April 20, 2016, Technical Advisory Committee on April 20, 2016 and the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Board on April 21, 2016. In addition, this document was reviewed and approved by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area on May 2, 2016. These meetings were noticed and time was allocated for public comment. In addition, the draft Unified Planning Work Program was available on the Metropolitan Transportation Planning

Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area website and available for comments to Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area during regular business hours between 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. All comments received from the public were considered and revisions were made where appropriate.

The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has also prepared a Citizens' Guide to Transportation Planning document that overviews the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area planning process. This document is available at the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area website or printed copies can be obtained by contacting the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area website or printed copies can be obtained by contacting the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area.

### 4. Regional, State and Federal Planning Emphasis Areas

There are no federal planning emphasis area Fiscal Years 2018-19 and 2019-20. There are three state planning emphasis areas in 2018 consisting of:

- Rural Transportation Planning The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has a Rural Advisor nonvoting member who represents the interests of the municipalities outside the Gainesville Metropolitan Area. In addition, an email is sent to the chief elected official and chief staff official with links to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area meeting packets and supporting materials that arre posted on its website.
- Transportation Performance Measures As required by the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act, Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area will be updated to address Transportation Performance Measures.
- ACES (Automated/Connected/Electronic/Shared-Use) Vehicles The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has amended its Transportation Improvement Program to include an automated bus route service development project. In addition, the Year 2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan will address this vehicle technology.

Appendix G includes descriptions of the federal and state planning emphasis areas and a matrix of tasks by planning emphasis areas to be addressed.

### 5. Title VI

The Unified Planning Work Program complies with the public involvement provisions of Title VI, which states: No person in the United States shall, on grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has adopted a Title VI Policy Statement and has also adopted a Title VI Complaint Process/Procedure. Attached as Appendix F is the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area's Title VI information.

### 6. Performance-Based Approach

The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area planning process will provide for the establishment and use of a performance-based approach to transportation decision-making to support national goals. Later in this document, the performance-based approach is used to identify measurable products for individual Unified Planning Work Program work tasks.

The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area will implement the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act performance measures and target setting requirements into its planning process and its long-range transportation plan and transportation improvement program. The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area will coordinate with the Florida Department of transportation regarding the establishment of performance measures and target setting.

### **D.** Ten Federal Planning Factors

Implementation of the transportation planning process addresses the Fixing America's Transportation System Ten Federal Planning Factors. Appendix C includes a matrix of the Ten Federal Planning Factors by the eight work tasks.

### E. Indirect Costs

The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area does not use a cost allocation plan for indirect costs. All costs are direct charged to budget line items. Staff services are provided by North Central Florida Regional Planning Council through a professional staff services agreement and are described in the Estimated Budget Tables as Consultant Services.

### F. Soft Match and In-Kind Financial Contribution

Section 120 of Title 23, United State Code, permits a state to use certain toll revenue expenditures as a credit toward the non-federal matching share of all programs authorized under Title 23, (with the exception of Emergency Relief Programs) and for transit programs authorized under Chapter 53 of Title 49, United States Code. This is in essence a "soft-match" provision that allows the federal share to be increased up to 100 percent to the extent credits are available. The soft match amount being utilized to match the Federal Highway Administration funding in the Unified Planning Work Program is 18.07 percent of Federal Highway Administration program funds for a total of \$213,846.

In addition to funding from the Federal Highway Administration, the Federal Transit Administration, the Florida Department of Transportation, Alachua County and the City of Gainesville, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area includes State Soft Match and Local Inkind (locally-determined amount) contributions in calculating its overall budget that is reported in the Unified Planning Work Program. The overall budget includes soft match contributions from the Florida Department of Transportation and in-kind contributions provided by Alachua County and the City of Gainesville and the University of Florida. In-Kind contribution amounts are determined and provided by each jurisdiction. Exhibit 1 shows the soft match and in-kind amounts identified for each task.

# Chapter I Organization and Management

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## Chapter I: Organization and Management

### A. Participants and Their Respective Roles in the Transportation Planning Process

The Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area is advised by the following committees and boards- the Citizens Advisory Committee, the Technical Advisory Committee, the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Board, the Alachua County Traffic Safety Team, and the Alachua County Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board. Each conducts its prescribed responsibilities at regularly scheduled meetings.

The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area is responsible for transportation planning in the Gainesville Metropolitan Area. The Technical Advisory Committee conducts research, reviews plans and programs and makes recommendations based upon technical expertise. The Citizens Advisory Committee and the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Board provide the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area with citizen viewpoints and recommendations. The Alachua County Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board works to increase transportation services to low-income persons, the elderly and persons with disabilities. Additional public input is provided through public meetings, meetings with local civic organizations, public workshops and public hearings. In addition, the Alachua County Traffic Safety Team develops recommendations to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area for safety-funded projects.

The work effort required to support the planning process will be conducted by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area, the Florida Department of Transportation Tallahassee Office and the Florida Department of Transportation District Two Office. The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area assembles and disseminates data, reports and other information generated by the continuing transportation planning process. Pursuant to a professional staff services agreement, the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council provides professional staff support to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area.

### **B.** Planning and Funding Agreements

The following planning and funding agreements have been executed by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area:

#### Organization Establishment and Function

Interlocal Agreement for Creation of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization (May 26, 2004) - The purpose of this Agreement is to ensure eligibility for the receipt of federal capital and operating assistance pursuant to 23 United States Code 134 and Section 3 (a) (2), 4 (a), 5 (g) (1) and 5 (1) of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended [49 United States Code 1602 (a) (2), 1603 (a), and 1604 (g) (1) and (1)], and to implement and ensure a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in coordinated plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the affected urbanized area in cooperation with the Florida Department of Transportation.

- Intergovernmental Coordination and Review and Public Transportation Coordination Joint Participation Agreement (January 26, 2007) - The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth mutually acceptable procedures for implementing the provisions of Title 23 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter 1, Part 450, Subpart A and B, Governor's Executive Order 83-150 and Federal Highway Program Manual 4-1-4.
- 3. <u>Organization Apportionment Voting Membership and Procedure, non-Voting Membership and Service Area Agreement (July 9, 2013)</u> This agreement with the Office of the Governor of Florida describes the voting membership and procedure, non-voting membership and includes the Gainesville Metropolitan Area map.

#### <u>Federal Funding-</u> <u>Federal Highway Administration Planning (Planning) and</u> <u>Federal Transportation Administration Section 5305(d)</u>

- 4. <u>Transportation Planning Funds Joint Participation Agreement (July 1, 2010)</u> The purpose of this Agreement is to assist in the undertaking of the planning funded portion of the Unified Planning Work Program of the Gainesville Metropolitan Area prepared by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area in conformance with 23 Code of Federal Regulations Part 1 and 23 Code of Federal Regulations 450, Subpart A, to provide financial assistance to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville activities, as required under 23 United States Code 134, to state the terms and conditions upon which such assistance will be provided, and to recite the understanding as to the manner in which the Project will be undertaken and completed. This agreement expires June 30, 2016 and is being replaced by a new agreement that will cover the same two-year period as the Unified Planning Work Program.
- 5. <u>Standard Joint Participation Agreement for Section 5305(d) Federal Transit Administration Funds-Cash Match (September 27, 2012)</u> The purpose of this Agreement is to provide Florida Department of Transportation assistance to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area for the undertaking of Federal Transit Administration funded work elements as defined in the Unified Planning Work Program, and to state the terms and conditions upon which such assistance will be provided. This agreement expires September 30, 2016 and is being replaced by a new agreement.

#### Organization Staffing- Professional Staff Services Agreement

6. <u>Professional Staff Services Agreement (July 1, 2010)</u> - The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the responsibilities of the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council as consultant to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area in performing the professional staff planning functions relative to the transportation planning process for the Gainesville Metropolitan Area, and to describe the cooperative procedures under which planning and programming will be conducted.

#### Joint Regional Planning Organization

7. <u>Interlocal Agreement for Creation of a Regional Transportation Plan (December 14, 2006)</u> - The purpose of this Agreement is to create a regional transportation plan which identifies project priorities for funding through the Florida Transportation Regional Incentive Program. Selected members of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area and the Ocala/Marion County Transportation Planning Organization serve as the Alachua/ Marion County Transportation Regional Incentive Committee.

Supplemental Organization Advisory Activity

8. <u>Interlocal Agreement for Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Board Funding (May 22, 2002)</u> - The purpose of this Agreement is for the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area to provide financial support to the City of Gainesville for providing staff services to the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Board. The Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Board advises Alachua County, the City of Gainesville and the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area on bicycle and pedestrian-related issues.

### C. Operational Procedures and Bylaws

The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area amended its Bylaws on December 4, 2017 for the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area, its Technical Advisory Committee and its Citizens Advisory Committee. The intent is to provide procedures and policies for the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area and its advisory committees in fulfilling the requirements for the transportation planning process for all modes of travel, and to ensure the accomplishment of the planning tasks within a cooperative framework properly related to comprehensive planning on a continuing basis. # Chapter II Work Program

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# Chapter II: Work Program

The 2018-19 and 2019-20 Unified Planning Work Program, covering the Fiscal Year from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 and the Fiscal Year from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020, was developed by Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area, in accordance with its *Public Involvement Plan*, with the cooperation and participation of the Florida Department of Transportation, the public and other transportation agencies.

The Work Program Section of the Unified Planning Work Program documents each specific transportation planning task to be undertaken during Fiscal Years 2018-19 and 2019-20, including the purpose of the task, previous work accomplished, proposed methodology, responsible agencies, cost estimates and proposed funding sources, as well as an end product.

The Unified Planning Work Program is made up of eight major sections. The final section contains summary tables detailing the Unified Planning Work Program tasks by participating agencies and funding sources.

The eight major sections of the Unified Planning Work Program are briefly described, as follows:

The Contractor shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices when the contract covers a program set forth in Appendix B of the Regulations.
- (3.) Solicitations for Subcontractors, including Procurements of Materials and Equipment: In all solicitations made by the Contractor, either by competitive bidding or negotiation for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment; each potential subcontractor or supplier shall be notified by the Contractor of the Contractor's obligations under this contract and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, religion or family status.
- (4.) Information and Reports: The Contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the *Florida Department of Transportation*, the *Federal Highway Administration, Federal Transit Administration, Federal Aviation Administration, and/or the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration* to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders and instructions. Where any information required of a Contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information the Contractor shall so certify to the *Florida Department of Transportation, Eederal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, and/or the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, and/or the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration*, the *Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration* as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.

- 1. Any person who believes that he or she, or any specific class of persons, has been subjected to discrimination or retaliation prohibited by the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, and related statutes, may file a written complaint. All written complaints received by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area shall be referred immediately by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning to the Florida Department of Transportation's District Two Title VI Coordinator for processing in accordance with approved State procedures.
- 2. Verbal and non-written complaints received by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area shall be resolved informally by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning. If the issue has not been satisfactorily resolved through informal means, or if at any time the person(s) request(s) to file a formal written complaint, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning shall refer the Complainant to the Florida Department of Transportation's District Two Title VI Coordinator for processing in accordance with approved State procedures.
- 3. The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning will advise the Florida Department of Transportation's District Two Title VI Coordinator within five (5) calendar days of receipt of the allegations. The following information will be included in every notification to the Florida Department of Transportation's District Two Title VI Coordinator.
  - (a) Name, address, and phone number of the complainant.
  - (b) Name(s) and address(es) of respondent.
  - (c) Basis of complaint (i.e., race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, religion, familial status or retaliation).
  - (d) Date of alleged discriminatory act(s).
  - (e) Date of complaint received by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area.
  - (f) A statement of the complaint.
  - (g) Other agencies (state, local or Federal) where the complaint has been filed.
  - (h) An explanation of the actions the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has taken or proposed to resolve the allegation(s) raised in the complaint.
- 4. Within ten (10) calendar days, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning will acknowledge receipt of the allegation(s), inform the complainant of action taken or proposed action to process the allegation(s), and advise the complainant of other avenues of redress available, such as the Florida Department of Transportation's Equal Opportunity Office.

- 5. Within sixty (60) calendar days, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning will conduct and complete a review of the verbal or non-written allegation(s) and based on the information obtained, will render a recommendation for action in a report of findings to the Chief Staff Official of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area.
- 6. Within ninety (90) calendar days of the verbal or non-written allegation(s) receipt, the Chief Staff Official of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area will notify the Complainant in writing of the final decision reached, including the proposed disposition of the matter. The notification will advise the Complainant of his/her right to file a formal complaint with the Florida Department of Transportation's Equal Opportunity Office, if they are dissatisfied with the final decision rendered by the Chief Staff Official of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area. The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning will also provide the Florida Department of Transportation's District Two Title VI Coordinator with a copy of this decision and summary of findings.
- 7. The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area Director of Transportation Planning will maintain a log of all verbal and non-written complaints received by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area. The log will include the following information:
  - a. Name of complainant.
  - b. Name of respondent.
  - c. Basis of complaint (i.e., race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, religion, familial status or retaliation).
  - d. Date verbal or non-written complaint was received by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area.
  - e. Date Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area notified the Florida Department of Transportation's District Two Title VI Coordinator of the verbal or non-written complaint.
  - f. Explanation of the actions the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has taken or proposed to resolve the issue raised in the complaint.

## Appendix G: Planning Emphasis Areas

### A. Federal Planning Emphasis Areas-2015

In 2015, the Federal Highway Administration reiterated its 2014 Planning Emphasis Areas- Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act Implementation, Regional Models of Cooperation and Ladders of Opportunity. Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act emphasis areas are also maintained in the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act. Descriptions of these emphasis areas are as follows:

#### Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act Implementation

Transition to Performance-Based Planning and Programming -

- Further develop performance management approach to transportation planning and programming; work with local planning partner to implement performance-based planning provisions such as collecting performance data, selecting and reporting performance targets for the metropolitan area and reporting actual system performance related to those targets.
- Consideration of exploring the use of scenario planning to develop the metropolitan transportation plan.

#### **Regional Models of Cooperation**

Ensure a Regional Approach to Transportation Planning by Promoting Cooperation and Coordination across Transit Agency, Metropolitan Planning Organization and State Boundaries -

- Consideration of thinking beyond traditional borders and adopt a coordinated approach to transportation planning that supports common goals and capitalizes on opportunities related to project delivery, congestion management, safety freight livability and commerce across boundaries.
- Consideration of revisiting the metropolitan area planning agreements to ensure that there are effective processes for cross-jurisdictional communication among State Departments of transportation, Metropolitan planning Organizations and providers of public transportation to improve collaboration, policy implementation technology use and performance management.
- Consideration of exploring the opportunity to partner with Regional Planning Organizations to conduct transportation planning in nonmetropolitan areas.

#### Ladders of Opportunity

Access to Essential Services -

- Consideration of identifying transportation connectivity gaps is accessing essential services, such as employment, health care, schools/education, and recreation.
- Consideration of development and implementation of analytical methods to indentify gaps in the connectivity of the transportation system.
- Consideration of development of infrastructure and operational solutions that provide the public, especially the traditionally underserved populations, with adequate access to essential services.

- Consideration of evaluation of effectiveness of public participation plans for engaging transportation disadvantaged communities in the transportation decision-making process.
- Consideration for updating the Section 5310 Coordinated Human Service Public Transportation Plans.
- Consideration for assessing the safety and condition of pedestrian and bicycle facilities.
- Consideration of evaluating compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, particularly around schools, concentrations of disadvantaged populations, social services, medical and transit facilities.

### B. State Planning Emphasis Areas-2018

In 2018, the Florida Department of Transportation provided its Planning Emphasis Areas- Rural Transportation Planning, Transportation Performance Measures and ACES (Automated/Connected/ Electric/Shared-Use) Vehicles. Descriptions of these emphasis areas are as follows:

#### **Rural Transportation Planning**

Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act defined the structure and responsibilities of designated regional transportation planning organizations in federal regulations for the first time. Florida Statutes include several provisions that require coordination with local governments including those in rural areas. Some rural communities in Florida face significant development pressures and need transportation investments to handle growing populations and economic activities. Others simply struggle to maintain their existing transportation system and with providing services to a spread-out community. Metropolitan Planning Organizations are encouraged to plan for and coordinate with rural governmental entities both within their planning boundaries as well as those areas outside of the current boundaries that are impacted by transportation movements between regions.

#### **Transportation Performance Measures**

Federal Highway Administration has finalized six interrelated performance rules to implement the transportation performance measures framework established by Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act and the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act. Collectively, the rules address challenges facing the transportation system, including: improving safety, maintaining the condition of the infrastructure, reducing traffic congestions, improving the efficiency of the system and freight movement, protecting the environment, and reducing delays in project delivery. The rules established national performance measures. State Departments of Transportation and Metropolitan Planning Organizations must establish targets for each measure. Planning documents will identify the strategies and investments used to reach the targets. Progress towards meeting the targets will be reported through new and existing mechanisms. Metropolitan Planning Organizations need to account in their UPWP for the effort necessary to satisfy the federal requirements. As Metropolitan Planning Organizations and Florida Department of Transportation venture into this first round of target setting and adopting performance measures into our planning products, more emphasis will be placed on this topic area. The cooperative efforts of Florida's Metropolitan Planning Organizations and Department of Transportation to insure this new planning tool will be effective and well-coordinated will need to be shown in the upcoming Unified Planning Work Programs.

#### ACES (Automated/Connected/Electric/Shared-Use) Vehicles

According to the Federal Highway Administration, "Transportation is in the midst of disruptive change from new technologies (automated and connected vehicles); new institutions (shared mobility firms); and changing attitudes (reduced car ownership). Across the nation, transportation planners are under pressure to develop performance-oriented policies, plans, and investment decisions that consider an increasingly complex transportation landscape. In the process, planners need to consider, but cannot yet reliably predict, the potential impact of disruptive and transformational Connected Vehicle and Automated Vehicle technologies on safety, vehicle ownership, road capacity, vehicle miles travelled, land-use, roadway design, future investment demands, and economic development, among others. While some forms of Connected Vehicle and Automated Vehicle are already being deployed across the United States, significant unknowns exist regarding the rate of technology adoption, which types of technologies will prevail in the marketplace, the interaction between Connected Vehicle/Automated Vehicles and various forms of shared mobility services, and the impacts of interim and widespread levels of Connected Vehicle/Automated Vehicle usage."

Adopting and supporting innovative technologies and business practices supports all seven goals of the Florida Transportation Plan and the federal planning factors found in the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act. Automated/Connected/Electric/Shared-Use Vehicles may lead to great improvements in safety, transportation choices, and quality of life for Floridians, our visitors and the Florida economy. Though there is a great deal of speculation and uncertainty of the potential impacts these technologies will have, Metropolitan Planning Organizations need to determine how best to address the challenges and opportunities presented to them by Automated/Connected/Electric/Shared-Use vehicles.

## Appendix H: Summary of District Two Planning Activities

#### **FDOT District Two Planning Activities**

District Two Planning Activities encompass continuing, cooperative, comprehensive efforts to coordinate State, District, regional and local transportation planning in the areas of policy planning, systems planning, statistics, environmental and safety. The District's Planning Activities include implementing policies, rules and procedures from Federal legislation (Fast Act) and State of Florida rules and policies, such as those contained in the FTP 2060, that provide a strategic approach to transportation investments for statewide, regional and local priorities.

The District's Planning Activities, and the FTP 2060 goals that are supported by the activities, are noted for reference.

#### Air Quality /Environmental

The Department supports policies and programs to reduce transportation's contribution to air quality and climate change. Statewide transportation policies aim to support Federal law, promote energy conservation and protect and enhance the environment. The current state objectives/policies include the 2060 Florida Transportation Plan objective:

Plan and develop transportation systems and facilities in a manner which protects and, where feasible, restores the function and character of the natural environment and avoids or minimizes adverse environmental impacts.

Plan and develop transportation systems to reduce energy consumption, improve air quality, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

The Governor's Action Team on Energy and Climate Change developed recommendations and strategies for reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Many of the Governor's Energy and Climate Change Action Team's recommendations reinforce on-going FDOT activities.

Activity supports the FTP Goal of transportation solutions that enhance Florida's environment and conserve energy

#### **Bicycle and Pedestrian/Safety Activities**

The District reviews and identifies possible opportunities to add bicycle and sidewalk accommodations to resurfacing and capacity projects. The District reviews and identifies safety issues for opportunities to recommend additional programs or grant opportunities. The District coordinates Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) plans and projects and recommends, to the extent feasible, additional bicycle and sidewalk facilities that are consistent with the Gainesville Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization and North Florida TPO plans. The District reviews FDOT project scopes and plans for recommended safety or traffic operations policy review, if any. The District maintains and documents crash data and roadway characteristics inventory for all 18 counties. District Two participates on the local Community Traffic Safety Teams. District Two hosted a two day workshop in January, 2012, at the Lake City District Office, entitled *Designing for Pedestrian Safety*.

This activity supports the FTP Goals of: \*safety and security for residents, visitors and businesses; \*maintains the long-standing priority for ensuring the safety and security of transportation customers, and \*more transportation choices for people and freight, providing a fuller range of options for moving people and freight

#### Community/Government Liaison

The District provides policy, technical and administrative support, overall coordination, cooperation and assistance to the TPO Policy Board, TPO Committees, local governments and communities to include full participation in technical and staff support for advisory committees. The District assists TPOs in conducting effective on-going transportation planning programs and processes; developing, maintaining and implementing plans and programs which meet state and federal requirements, and to promote cooperation among their planning processes and consistency in their plans and programs. The on-going programs and plans include the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), List of Priority Projects (LOPP), Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), Public Involvement Plan (PIP) and other plans and policy documents. The District coordinates with the TPOs to meet critical deadlines and to process amendments to the TIP and State Transportation Improvement Project (STIP). The District is responsible for conducting Joint Certification with the TPOs and ensuring that the planning process is certified. The District develops materials for the Five Year Work Program and coordinates the public involvement and presentations of the Work Program.

\*safety and security for residents, visitors and businesses; maintains the long-standing priority for ensuring the safety and security of transportation customers \*more transportation choices for people and freight, providing a fuller range of options for moving people and freight

\*agile, resilient and quality infrastructure, which focuses on maintaining conditions for all modes, as well as emphasizing responsiveness to changing technologies and market trends, and resiliency to risks

\*transportation solutions that enhance Florida's environment and conserve energy

\*transportation solutions that support quality places to live, learn, work and with emphasis on how transportation decisions can contribute to stronger communities, including greater emphasis on transportation's contribution to public health and the changing needs of a diverse population

#### **Corridor Planning Studies**

The District conducts studies to identify and evaluate mobility issues on major travel corridors, and evaluates the effectiveness and impacts of proposed alternatives, including a no build alternative. The results may range from a set of short-term recommended improvements that address specific problems to a long-range comprehensive action plan for improving the corridor. Project studies are both on and off the State Highway System.

The Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) was established by the Florida Legislature in 2003 to enhance Florida's economic prosperity and competitiveness. The SIS encompasses transportation facilities of statewide and regional significance, and is focused on the movement of passengers and freight. The District conducts studies on the SIS that include the development of strategies and plans for service, interchange spacing and access management. This may include preparation of Action Plans, Master Plans, corridor studies, managed lanes and others as identified. The District coordinates its plans and projects with major freight carriers and the region's seaports, airports and public transportation providers.

This activity supports the FTP Goals of

\*more transportation choices for people and freight, providing a fuller range of options for moving people and freight

\*efficient and reliable mobility for people and freight shifts, including all modes as well as supporting regulatory processes

This activity supports all seven FTP Goals.

<sup>\*</sup>efficient and reliable mobility for people and freight shifts, including all modes as well as supporting regulatory processes

<sup>\*</sup>transportation solutions that support Florida's global economic competitiveness, including emphasis on trade and logistics, while also supporting Florida's visitor industry and diversification into innovation industries

<sup>\*</sup>transportation solutions that support Florida's global economic competitiveness, including emphasis on trade and logistics, while also supporting Florida's visitor industry and diversification into innovation industries

#### **Design Traffic Forecast**

The District develops and updates traffic projections for state highway corridors and other regional roadways and facilities. These traffic projections are necessary to support road design for capacity and operational improvements and pavement design for resurfacing. The District provides traffic count updates annually, as well as historic and trend data, traffic forecasts, mapping and transportation modeling assistance, as requested.

This activity supports the FTP Goal of mobility:

\*efficient and reliable mobility for people and freight shifts from a focus on reducing travel time and delay to making the entire transportation system more efficient and reliable, including all modes as well as supporting regulatory processes

#### **Development of Regional Impact (DRI) Review**

Performing under Florida Statutes and associated rules and policies, District Two staff serves in an advisory capacity to two regional planning councils, local governments and the state Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO), by evaluating the projected transportation impacts from large, multi-use land development projects known as DRIs. If such land development projects adversely impact the level of service on nearby roads, planners identify these roads as deficient and propose suitable remedies to address the problem. A transportation analysis may start with the initial application for development approval (ADA) for a new DRI and culminate in a local government development order (DO). District Two staff continues to re-evaluate the project's transportation impacts through the Notice of Proposed Change (NOPC) proposed by a developer to amend the development order. The District provides comment to local governments and DEO, as appropriate, on local governments (PUD) evaluation and evaluation and appraisal reports (EAR). The Districts participates in traffic methodology reviews and meetings for DRIs, Planned Unit Developments (PUDs), and the establishment of Multi-Modal Transportation Districts and Transit Oriented Developments, as appropriate.

This activity supports the FTP Goals of transportation solutions that support quality places to live, learn, work and plan, with emphasis on how transportation decisions can contribute to stronger communities, including greater emphasis on transportation's contribution to public health and the changing needs of a diverse population

#### **Joint Participation Agreements/Local Agency Program**

The District develops, coordinates and reviews Joint Participation Agreements with TPOs and local government staff. The District coordinates and assists local agencies and local and county government staff with a certification process (Local Agency Program – LAP) for use of federal dollars. The LAP certification and program allows FDOT to contract with other governmental agencies to develop, design, acquire right-of-way, and construct transportation facilities that meet all federal requirements and to reimburse these governmental agencies for services provided to the traveling public.

The Efficient Transportation Decision-Making (ETDM) Process is designed to link planning with the NEPA process and the streamlining objectives identified in the Transportation Efficient Act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (TEA-21) legislation. District Two has implemented the ETDM process in all 18 counties. The District has an ETDM Coordinator and each TPO participates with an ETDM reviewer or participant on the Environmental Technical Advisory Team (ETAT) conducting project screening and review. For counties not within a TPO, the District Coordinator provides this planning level screening in concert with the local government.

#### Level of Service/Statistics

The District provides an annual capacity review, entitled District Two Level of Service Report, where the District Identifies the roadway level of service for existing and future years, determines planning level of need and determines timing of improvements. A level-of-service analysis is conducted for all Strategic Intermodal System (SIS), and State Highway System (SHS) designated facilities for the 18 counties in District Two. The District also participates on the TPOs Level of Service Committees. The Transportation Statistics Office is the principal source for highway and traffic data. Transportation statistics include traffic data collection (for example, AADT) system support data and GIS data, as well as mapping.

The District reviews Future Land Use Elements, Capital Improvements Elements and Five Year Schedules of Capital Improvements and coordinates with the Department Economic Opportunity, other public agencies and local governments regarding the projected transportation impacts of the comprehensive plan amendment.

The District will coordinate as needed regarding the implementation of transportation mitigation proposals to the State system pursuant to recent changes to Florida Statutes.

#### Long-Range Transportation Plan Update and Maintenance

The District provide technical and policy advisory assistance to the District Two TPOs in developing, updating and maintaining their Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) through coordinated and consistent effort. The District ensures that TPOs are aware of any Federal or State requirements and legislative changes involving compliance of the LRTP. The District provides state and federal revenue forecasts and district transportation costs.

District Two and the TPOs work in a coordinated and consistent effort by using a mutually agreed upon set of modeling and planning assumptions for the LRTP process. The District participates in the review of the overall performance of the Northeast Florida Regional Planning Model-Activity Based (NERPM-AB) and the Gainesville Urban Area Transportations Planning Model (GUATS), in the maintenance of the TPOs long range plans and in the conduct of corridor and sub -area transportation studies to identify needed model enhancements and refinements.

The District supports the Northeast Florida Transportation Applications Forum as a way to provide an exchange of information on planning, LRTP and modeling issues to TPOs, district staff and local governments.

The specific studies will be identified as needs are identified.

District staff coordinates with local governments, the Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA), a multi-modal independent state agency, and the Gainesville Regional Transit System (RTS) in development and review of planning and design of highway and premium transit (i.e. bus rapid transit) projects.

#### **Regional Transportation Planning Coordination**

The District provides on-going technical and policy advisory assistance to the TPOs and counties in District Two for participation in the Transportation Regional Incentive Grant Program (TRIP). FDOT staff conducts meetings and workshops to assist in development and understanding of the TRIP requirements and process.

District planning staff participate in the meetings of both TPOs Citizen Advisory Committees (CAC), Technical Advisory/Coordinating Committees (TCC/TAC), and in public meetings and forums associated with the development of the Long Range Transportation Plans (LRTPs) and the Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs). In addition, the District regularly attends meeting of citizen groups and elected officials meetings such as the City of Jacksonville Citizen

Planning Advisory Committees (CPAC), town hall meetings, and neighborhood and community group meetings and the District maintains daily response and coordinate for public inquiries and concerns.

Annually, the District presents its' Tentative Five Year Work Program at scheduled public meetings and TPO meetings, and comments and public input are solicited with regard to the proposed projects contained in the Tentative Work Program. The District also assists the North Florida TPO (NF TPO) in presenting their DRAFT Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) at various meetings of local elected officials and community organizations throughout the NF TPO region. District staff and the NF TPO staff answer questions and provide follow up information whenever requested.

The District, through its Public Information Office, has a comprehensive communications plan that makes us of in-house video production, social media, and targeted media relations to communicate the FDOT's vision, mission, planning, designing, traffic operations and safety, construction, and asset maintenance efforts programs and projects. Efforts are also expanding to determine information needs of visitors at the I-95 and I-75 Welcome Centers.
