# **Introduction**

Public transportation is provided in the City of Gainesville, and adjacent areas of Alachua County, by the City of Gainesville Regional Transit System. The Regional Transit System operates a fleet of 88 diesel buses on its fixed-route system within a service area of approximately 74 square miles and over 149,000 population. There are 36 routes in the system, including ten routes that serve the University of Florida campus. During full service weekdays, the Regional Transit System operates 21 fixed routes, four late evening routes and nine routes on the University of Florida campus.

From 1991 through 1994, the Regional Transit System experienced declining ridership. However, in 1997, a partnership between the University of Florida and the City of Gainesville enabled the Regional Transit System to realign some of its existing fixed routes and to increase frequencies to provide better connections between routes and better service to the University of Florida campus. This partnership included pre-paid unlimited transit access for all University of Florida students, staff and faculty. Since 1996, ridership on the system has increased from about two million annual riders to more than nine million annual riders today.

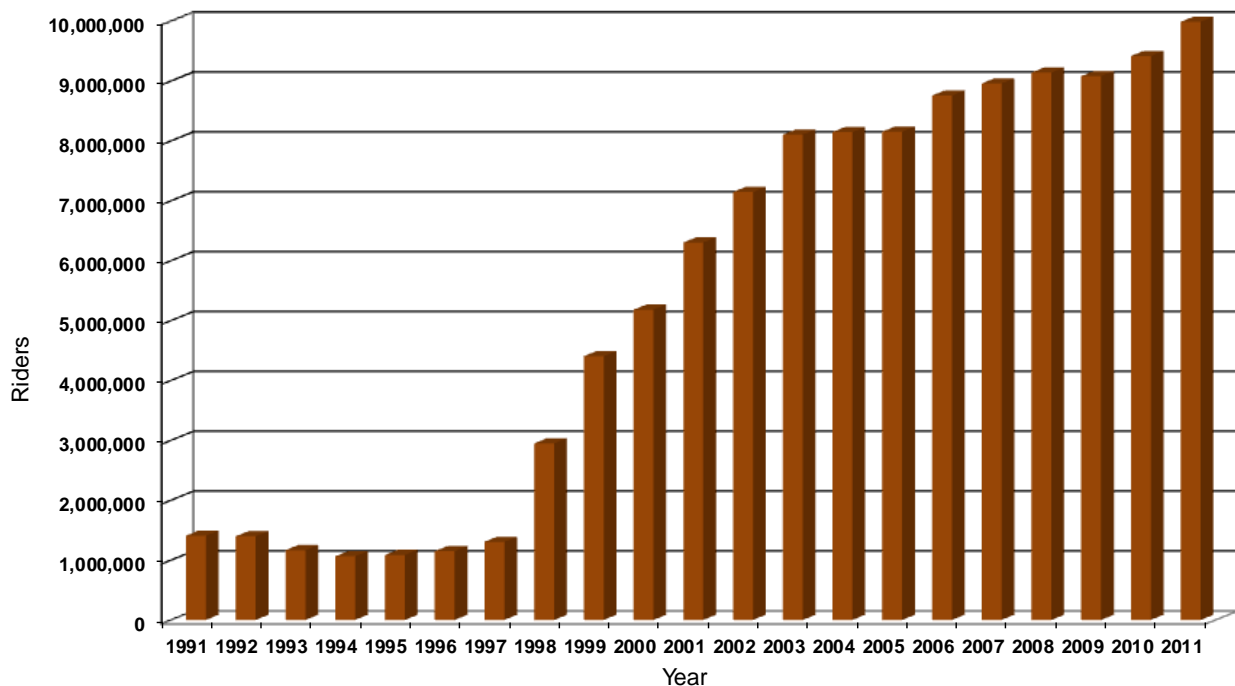
## Chapter I: Annual Ridership Trend Systemwide, 1991-2011

This chapter provides an overview of the systemwide transit ridership trends from 1991 to 2011 (see Illustration 1.1). Significant increases in ridership started in 1998, the year after the City of Gainesville and the University of Florida partnership was established.

Illustration 1.2 shows the distribution of average annual ridership from 2007 to 2011 on different routes. As shown in Illustration 1.2, routes 1, 5, 9, 12, 20 and 35 have the highest annual average ridership, ranging from 400,000 riders per day to 925,000 riders per day.

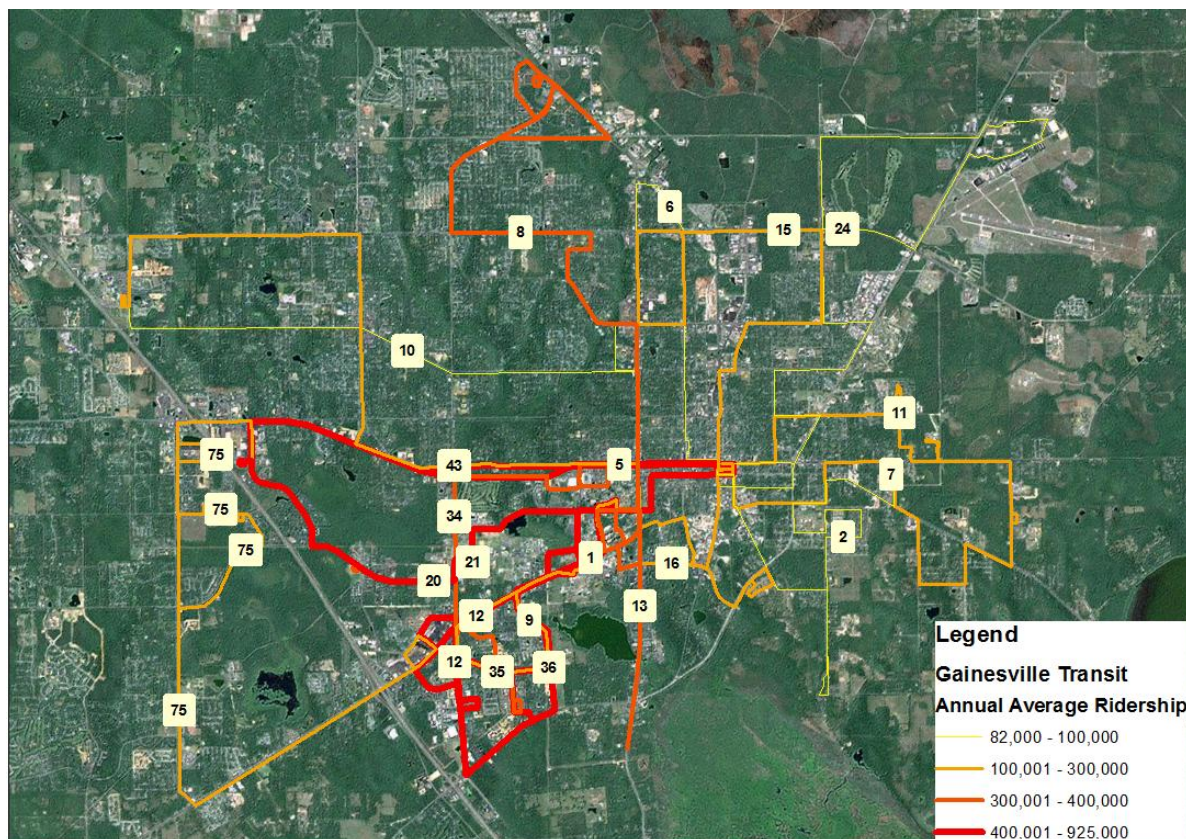
### Annual Regional Transit System Ridership Systemwide, 1991-2011

## **Chapter II: Monthly Ridership Trend City Routes, 2007-2011**

The Transportation Mobility element of the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan identifies 23 areas as major trip “generators” or “attractors”. These areas are identified based on the existing and future land use map series, including neighborhood centers within the City and those identified by Alachua County in the unincorporated portions of the Gainesville Urbanized Area.

The routes with the highest annual average ridership are 1, 9, 12, 20, 21 and 35. Illustration 2.1 shows the annual total ridership for each route for Fiscal Year 2010-11. The following paragraphs and illustrations show monthly growth trends for each of these routes.

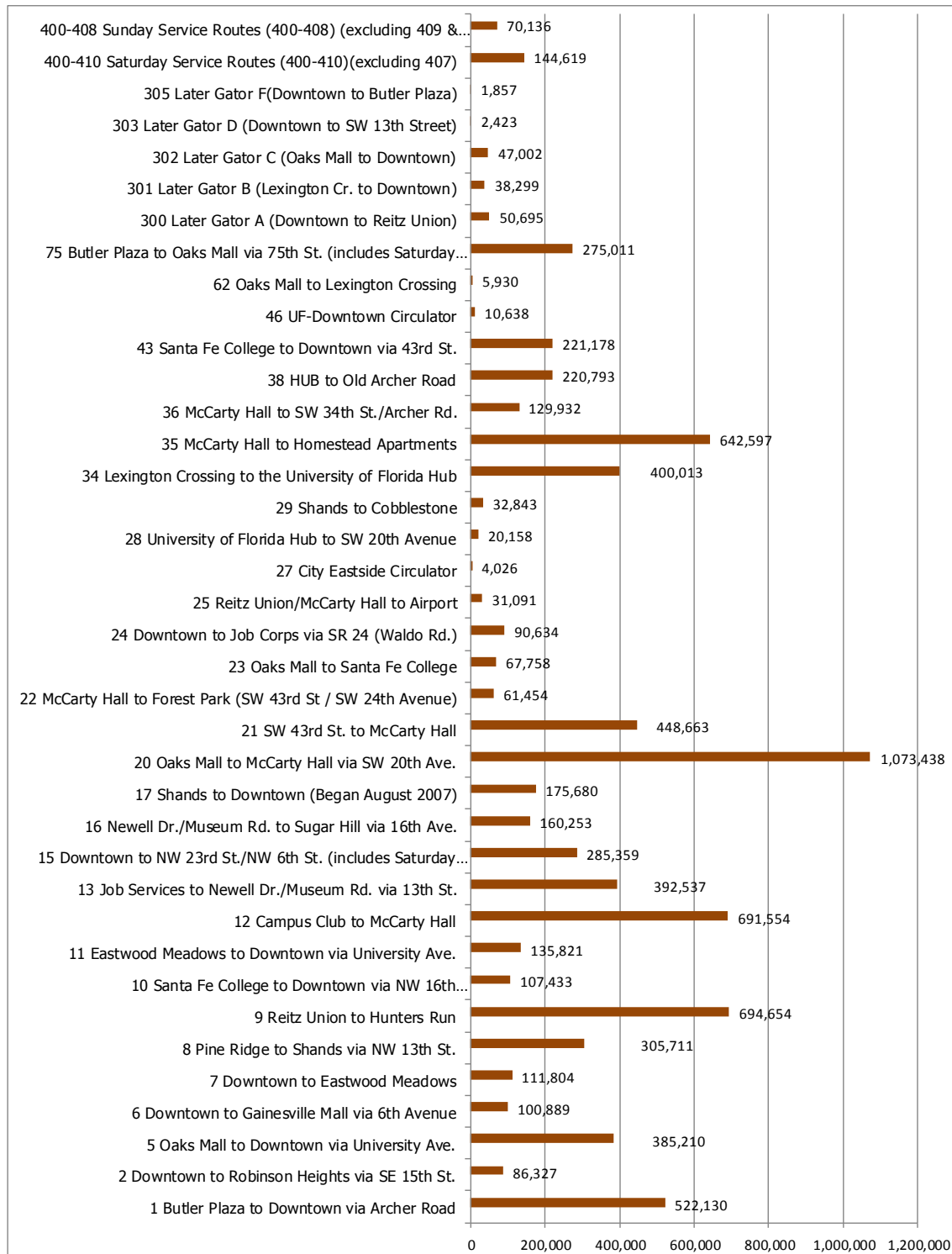

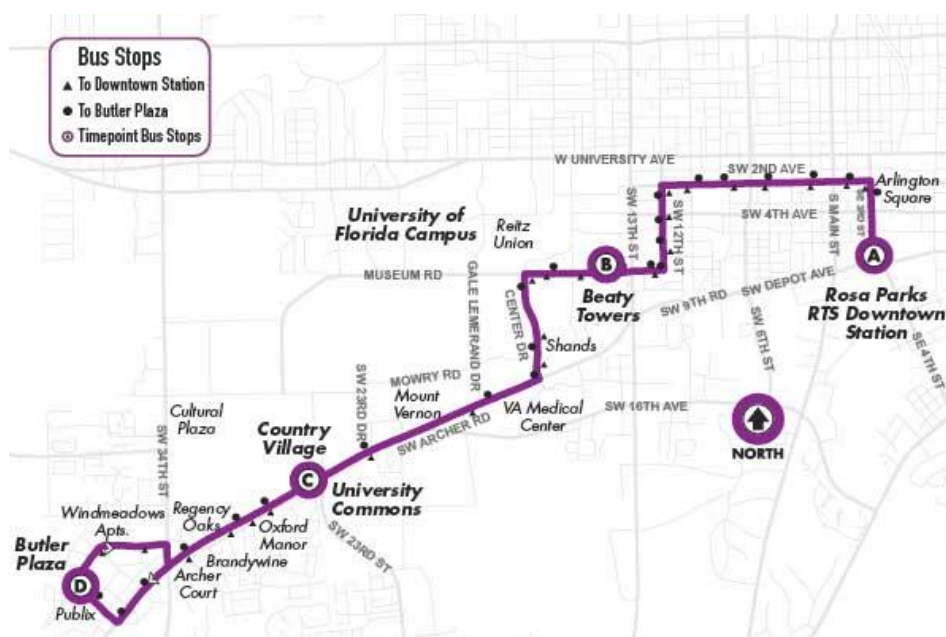
#### Total Ridership - City Routes Fiscal Year 2010-11

### Route 1 Map Rosa Parks Downtown Station to Butler Plaza

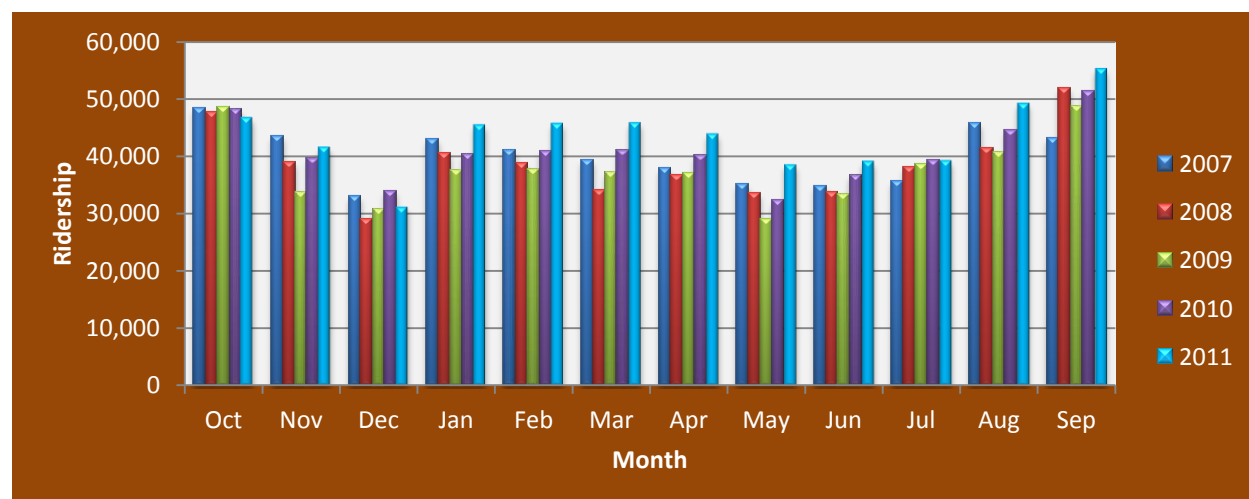

### Route 9 Map Reitz Union to Hunters Run

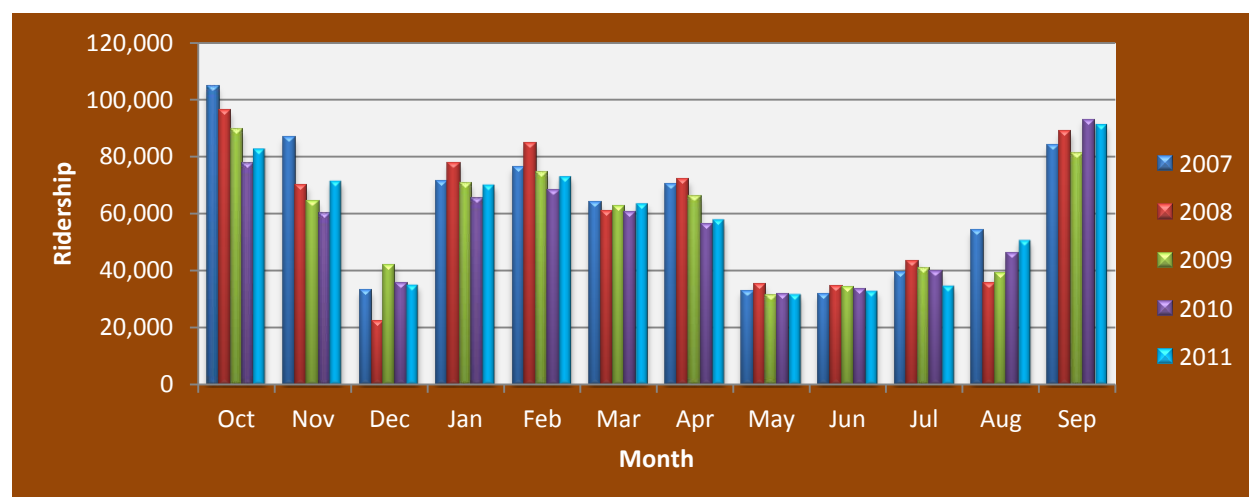

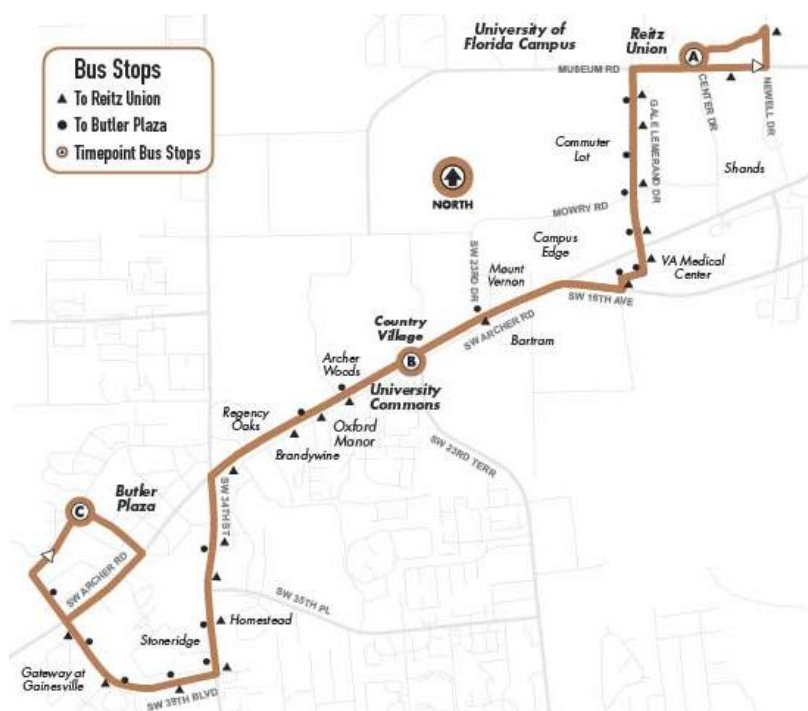
### Monthly Trend for Route 9 City of Gainesville, 2007-2011

### Route 12 Map Reitz Union to Butler Plaza

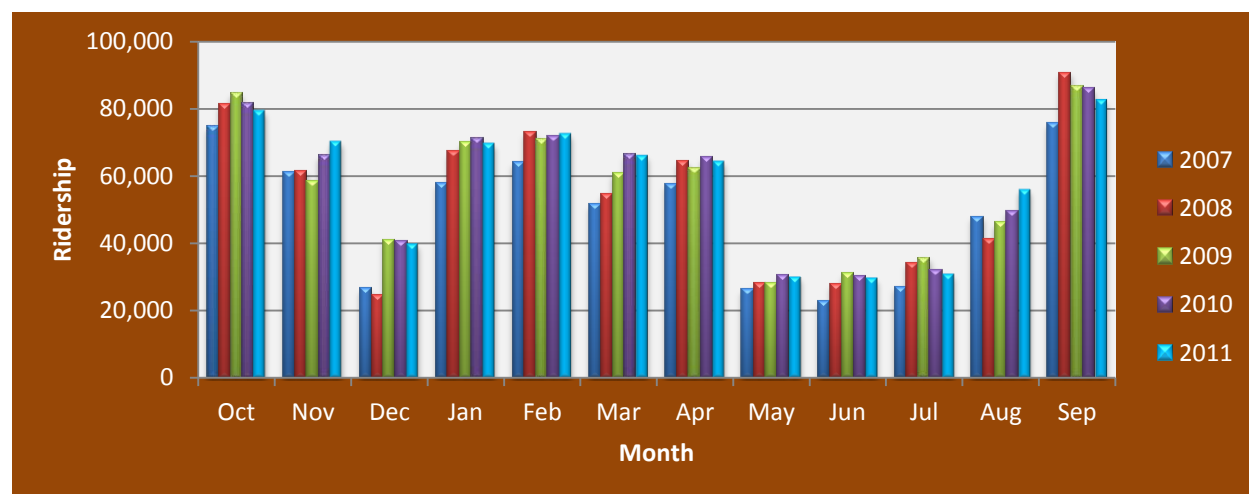

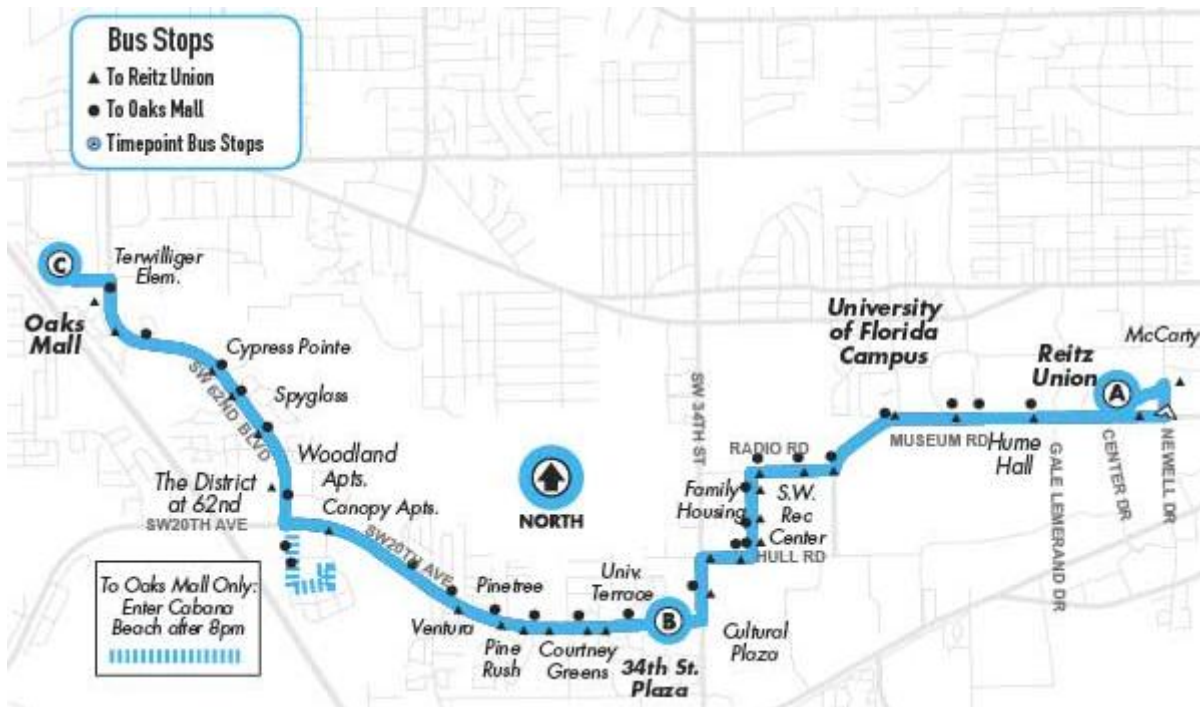
### Monthly Trend for Route 12 City of Gainesville, 2007-2011

### Monthly Trend for Route 20 City of Gainesville, 2007-2011

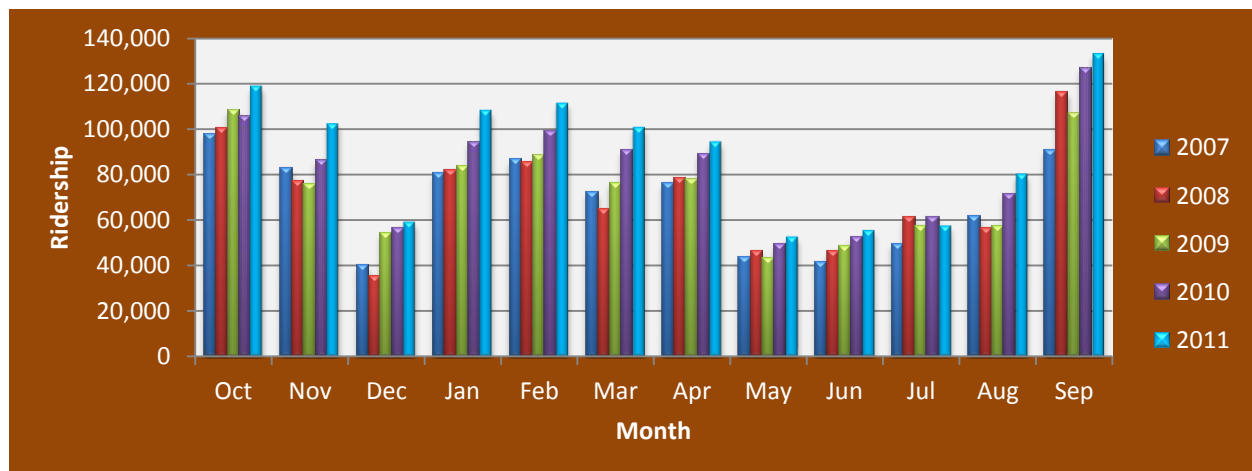
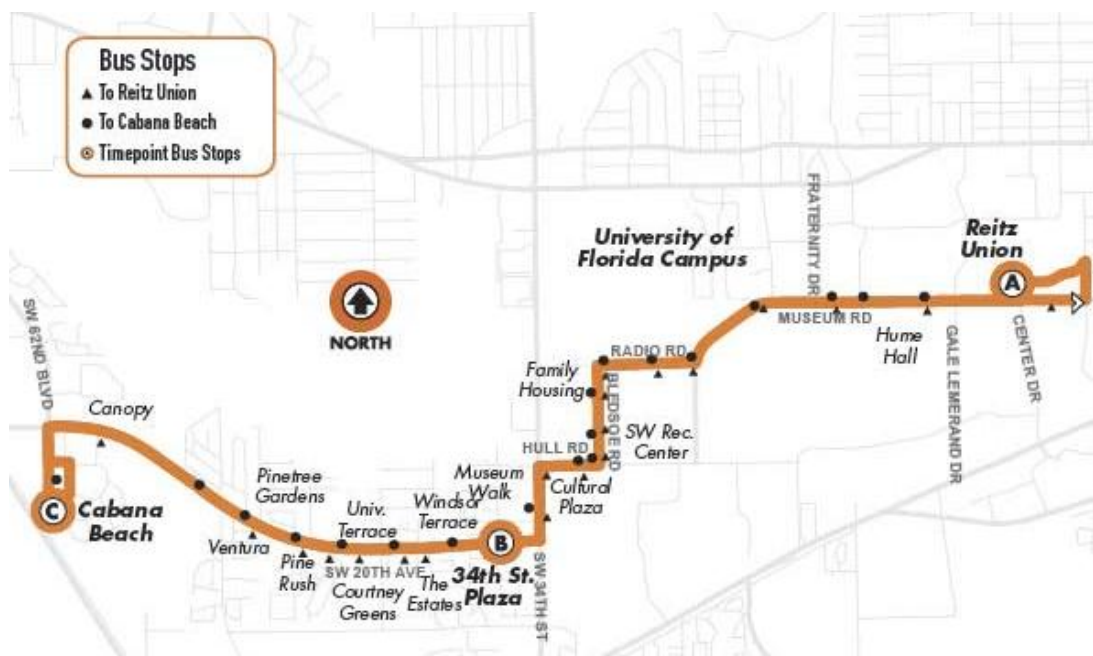

Route 21 Map Reitz Union to Cabana Beach

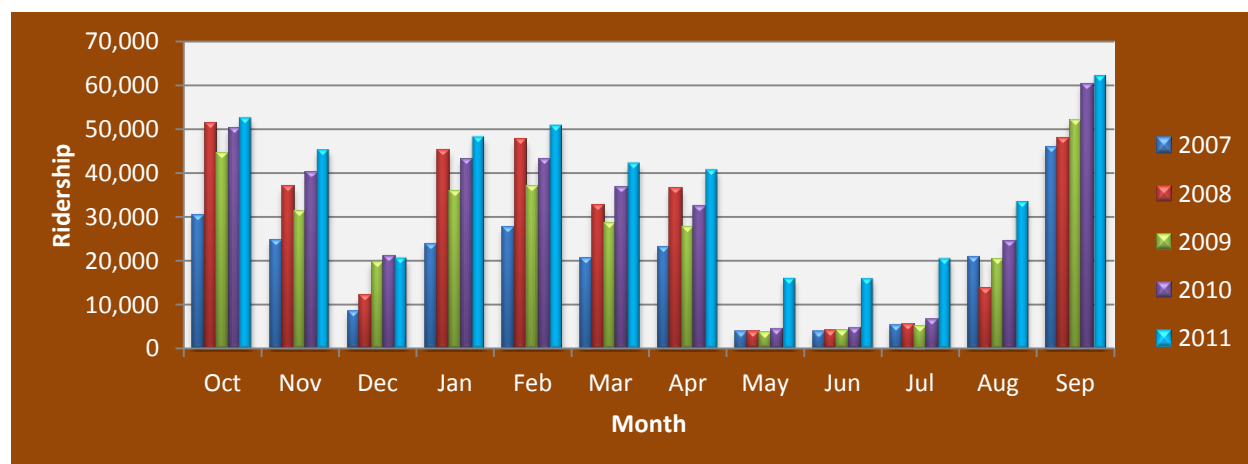

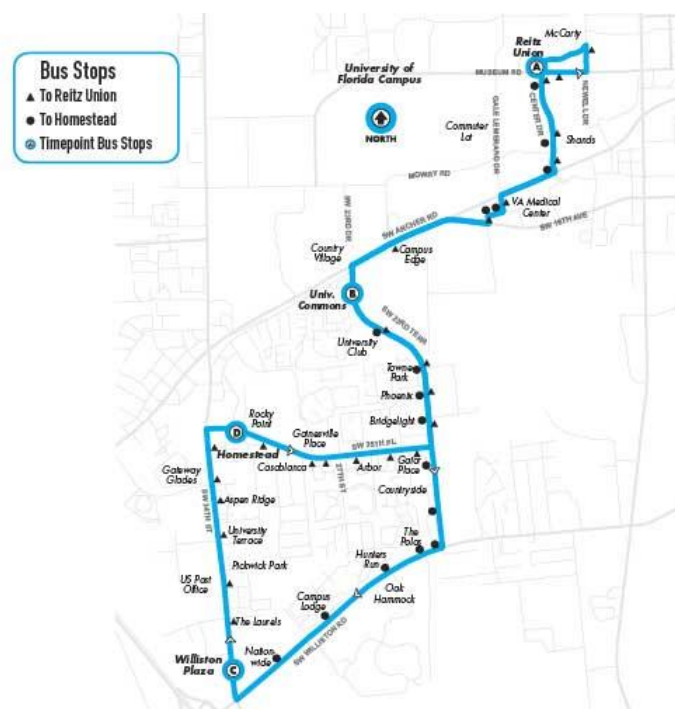
Monthly Trend for Route 21

### Route 35 Map Reitz Union to Homestead

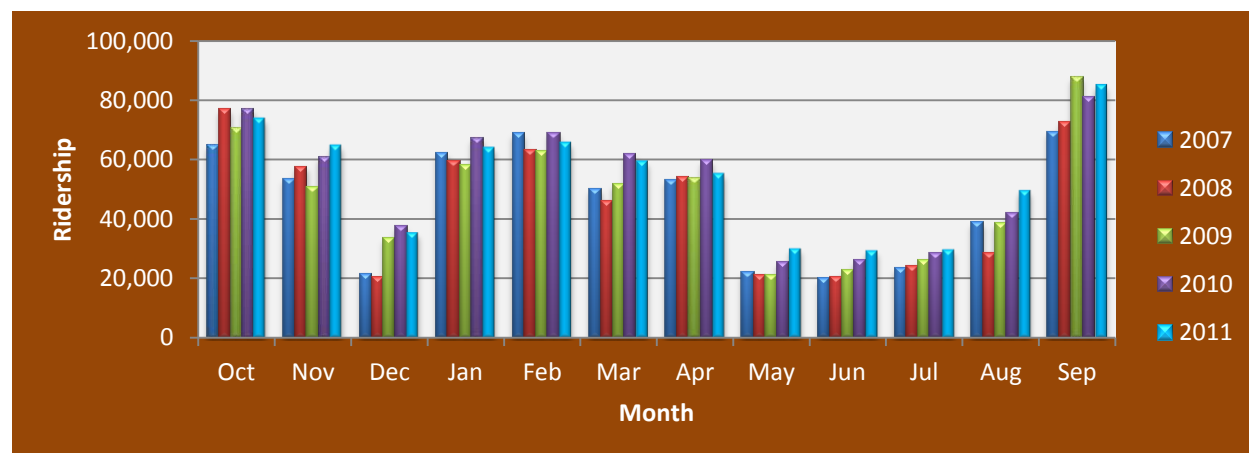

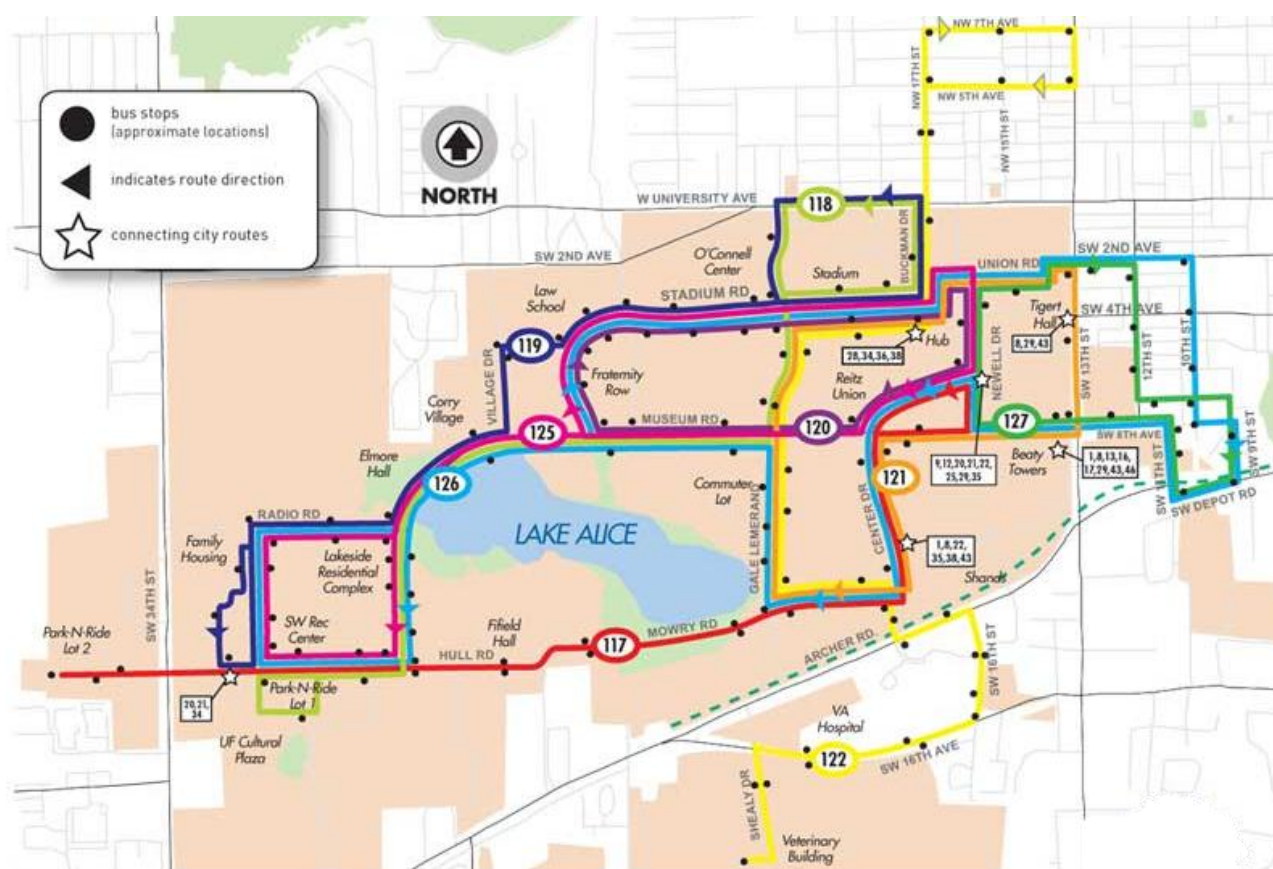
## Chapter III: Monthly Ridership Trend Campus Routes, 2007-2011

The Regional Transit System operates nine routes on the University of Florida campus (see Illustration 3.1). This section discusses monthly ridership trends for these nine routes. Compared with city routes, these routes have a greater proportion of student riders. Therefore, their ridership is influenced by the University's academic calendar. For example, all of these routes experienced a significant decrease in ridership during the months of December, May and June.

About one-half of the campus routes had a decreasing monthly ridership trend from 2007 to 2010, while the other one-half had an increasing ridership trend. Generally, the monthly ridership for routes 119, 121, 125, 126 and 127 increased, and routes 117, 118, 120 and 122 decreased.

Campus Routes Map 2011

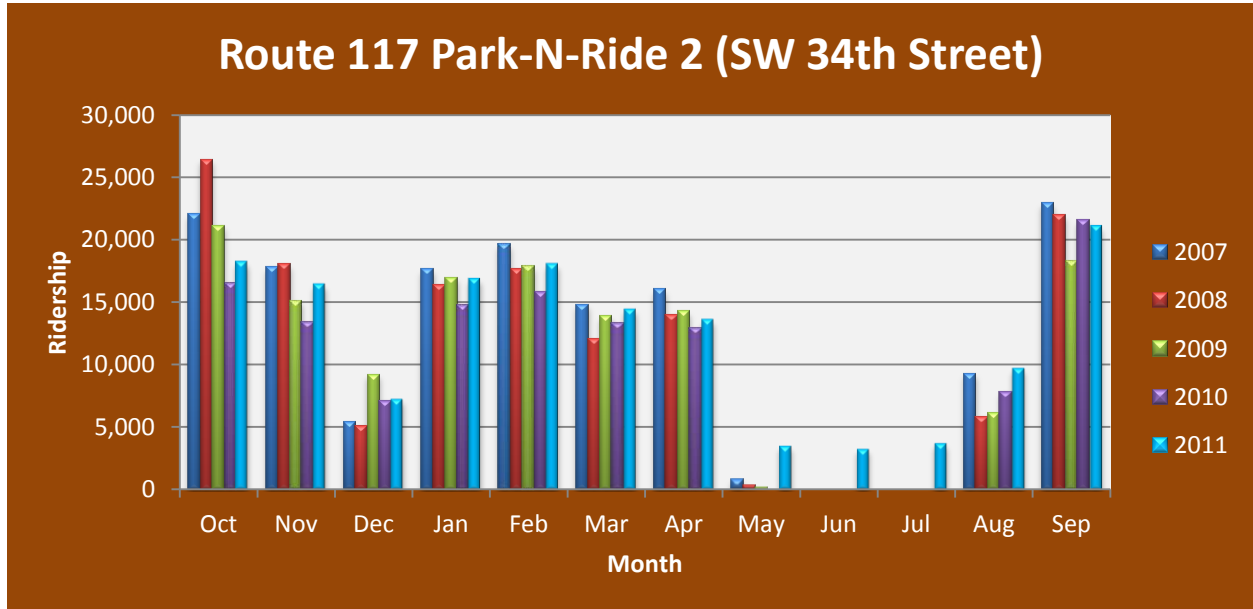

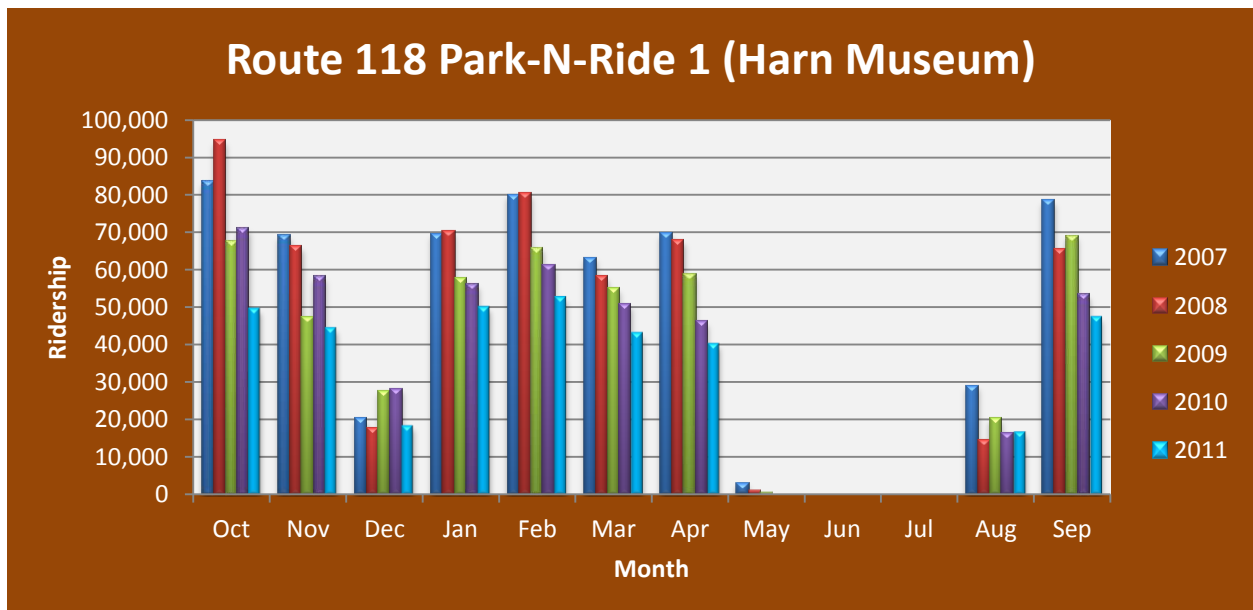

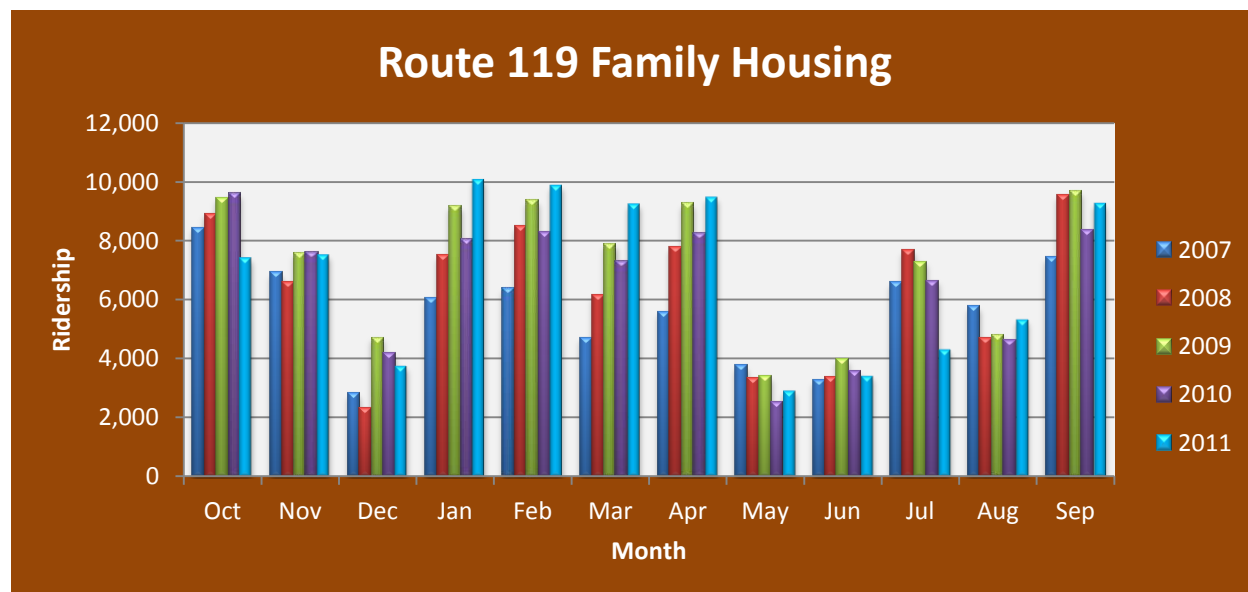
#### Monthly Trend for Route 118 University of Florida Campus Routes, 2007-2011





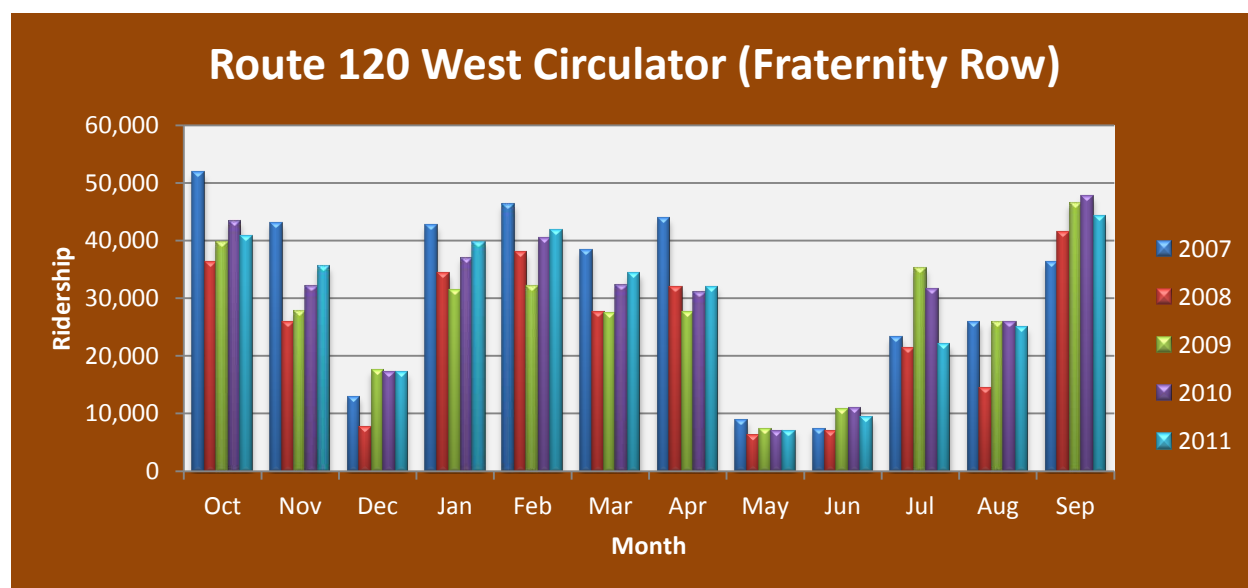

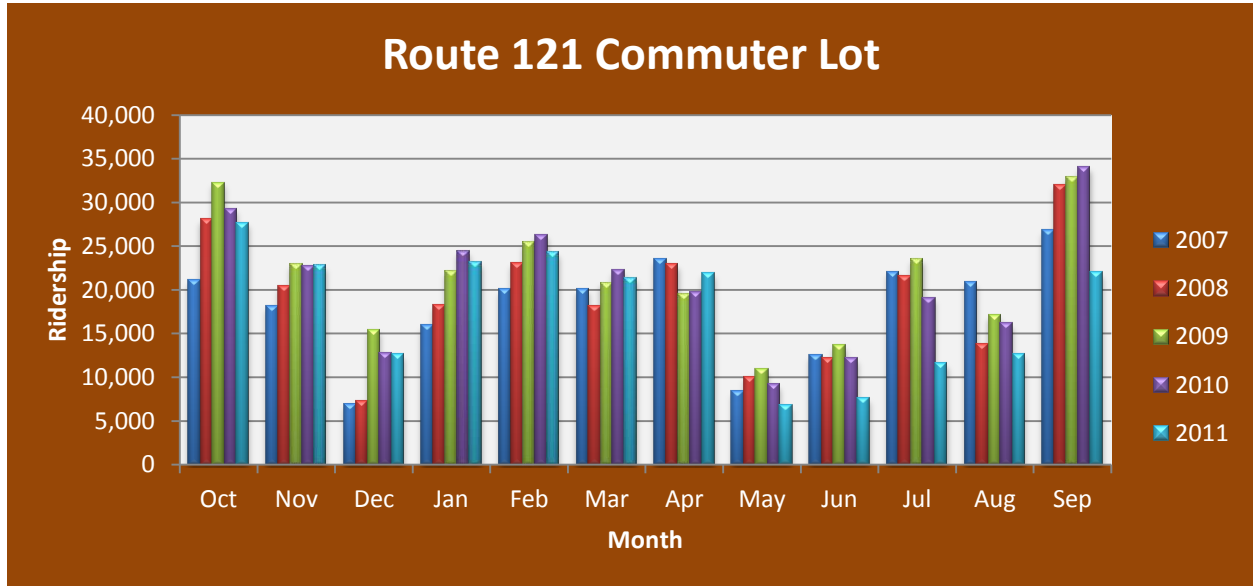
#### Monthly Trend for Route 120 University of Florida Campus Routes, 2007-2011





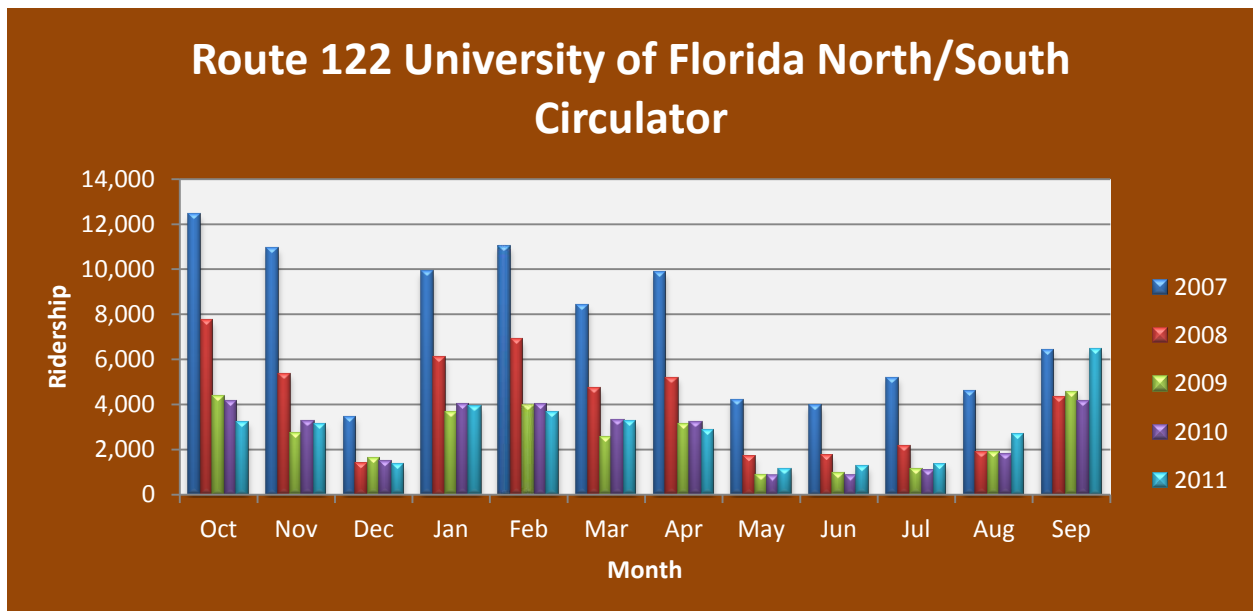

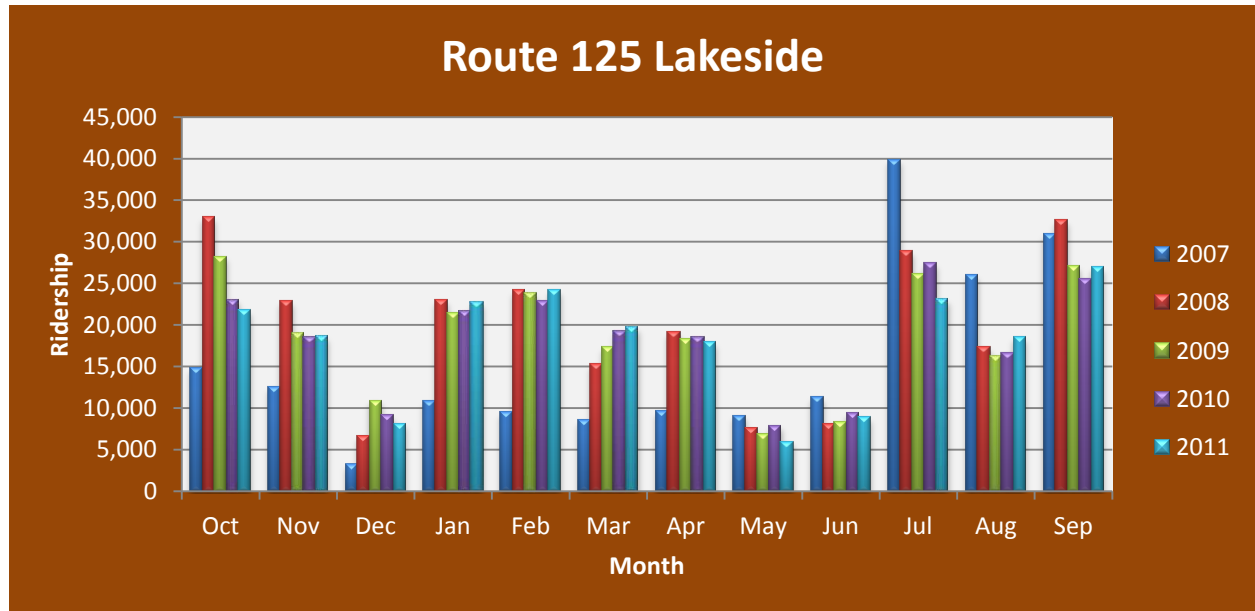
**Monthly Trend for Route 122  
University of Florida Campus Routes, 2007-2011**





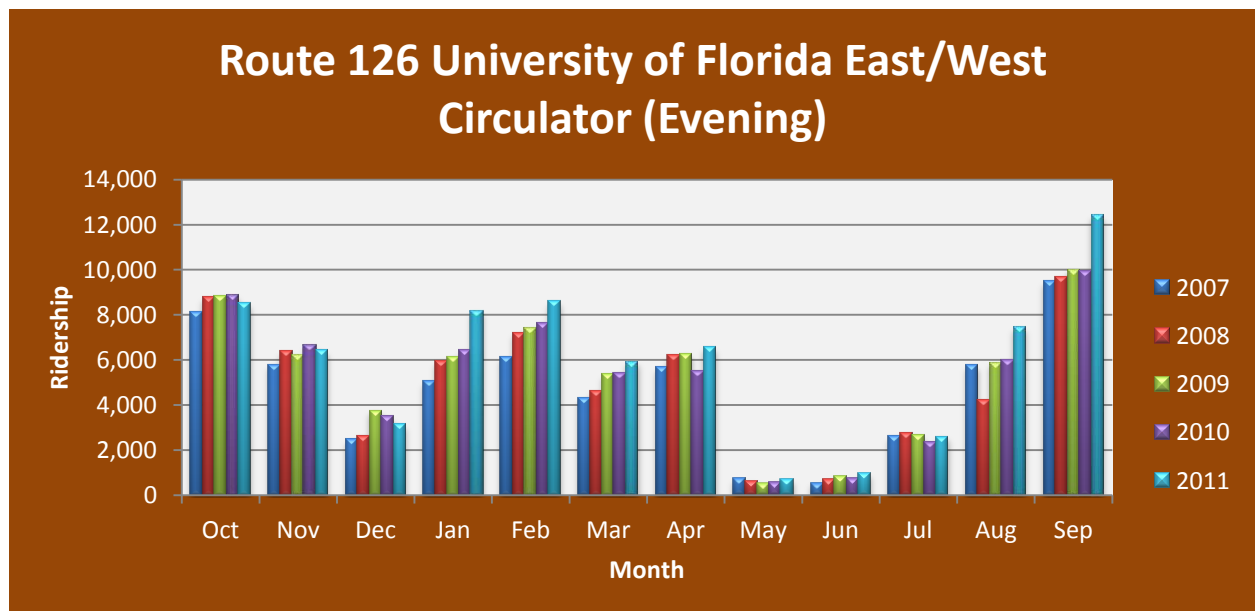

University of Florida Campus Routes, 2007-2011**

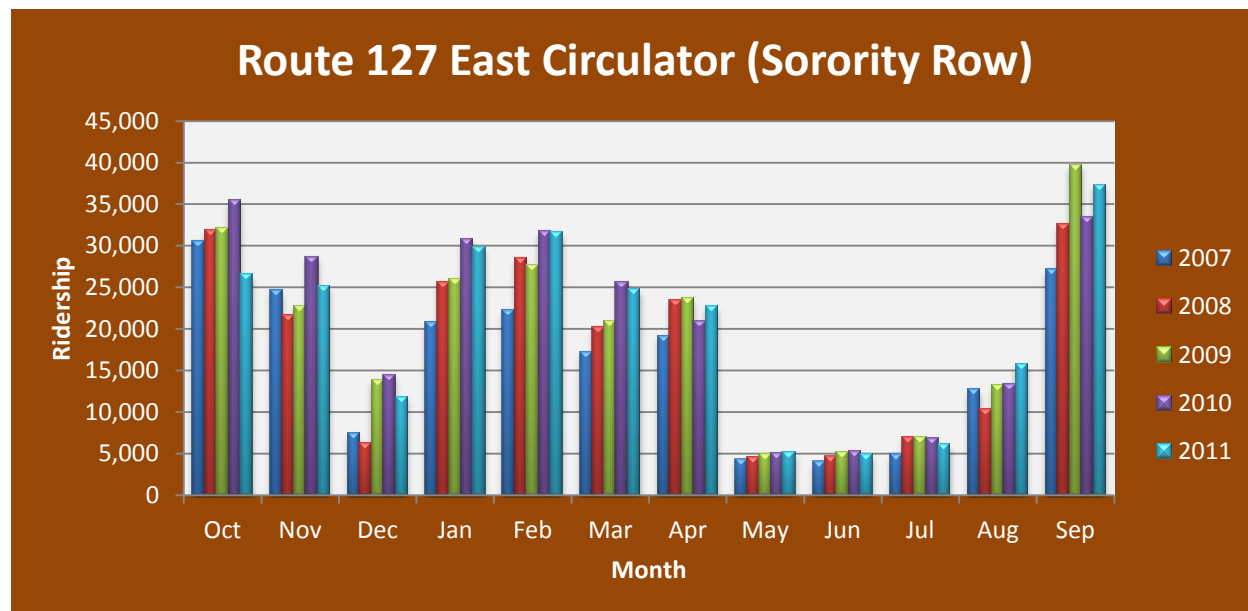

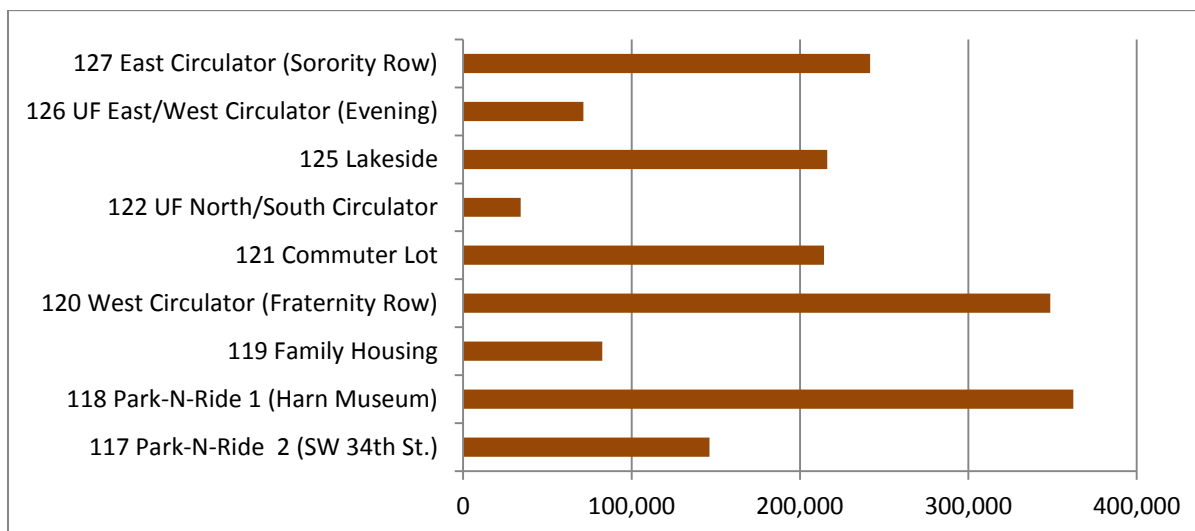

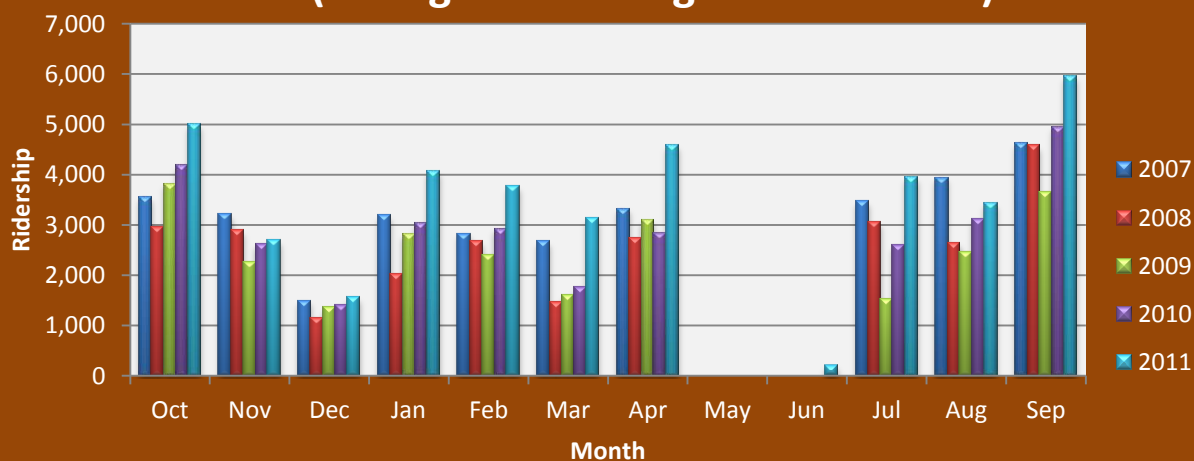




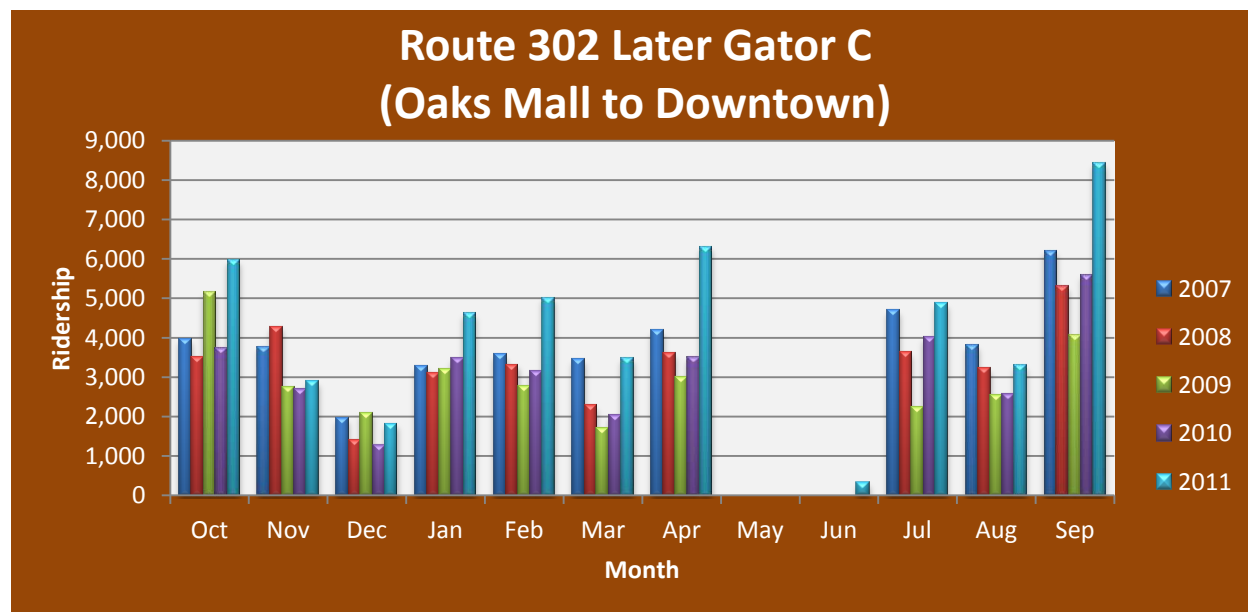
### Route 300 Later Gator A (Downtown to Reitz Union)
